



### Response to (b)(7)(C) allegations in the media:

Allegation #1 - That "the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives permitted hundreds of guns to be purchased and retained by suspected straw buyers with the expectation they might cross the border and even be used in crimes".

Response to #1 -

"At the outset, the allegation described in your January 27 letter-- that ATF "sanctioned" or otherwise knowingly allowed the sale of assault weapons to a straw purchaser who then transported them into Mexico—is false."

Neither the USAO nor ATF was engaged in an effort "to let guns flow to straw buyers" or to "walk" guns that could have been seized under any lawful theory with available facts to prove the theory.

The guns flow FROM straw buyers and until agents observe illegal conduct they cannot treat them as anything other than ordinary buyers. At the time of transfer of the firearms from the FFL to the straw purchaser based upon the facts available to the FFL at the time of the sale, the sales to the "straw purchasers" are lawful; and seizure of the weapons in the hands of those purchasers without evidence of criminality would violate the United States Constitution and would be an unlawful seizure and deprivation of property rights without cause. (Fourth and Fifth Amendments).

In these investigations, there may come a point over the course of an investigation where ATF believes, though it is well short of proof beyond a reasonable doubt required in criminal cases, that they can prove that a particular person only buys guns for the purposes of illegal trafficking. However, seizure of the guns at that point may not be legal because purchasing multiple long guns in Arizona is lawful, transferring them to another is lawful and even sale or barter of the guns to another is lawful unless the United States can prove by clear and convincing evidence that the firearm is intended to be used to commit a crime. (18 USC 924 (d))

In short, the law does not permit agents to take guns away from anyone who buys ten AKs at a time solely because they bought multiple guns.

The full array of rights available to indicted defendants is also available to those persons suspected of committing gun crimes, and the government cannot violate legitimate gun owners rights by prematurely seizing their guns.

Allegation #2 – That "the decision — part of a Phoenix-based operation code named "Fast and Furious" — was met by strong objections from some front-line agents who feared they were allowing weapons like AK-47s to "walk" into the hands of drug lords and gun runners, internal agency memos show".

Response to #2 - memo vs. e-mails, supervisor never received objections directly from agents in group. After receiving complaint from SA about working nights/weekends and the wire room schedule,

ASAC Gillett and GS had meeting regarding schism. At no time were these alleged objections raised.

Allegation #3 and #4 – That " has taken his misgivings to the Senate Judiciary Committee as a whistleblower after his concerns were dismissed by his supervisors (#3) and initially ignored by the Justice Department's inspector general (#4)".

Response to #3 and #4 - Refer to answer #2

Allegation #5 – That told the Center he and several of his colleagues wanted to intercept some of the weapons but their objections were repeatedly overruled by ATF supervisors".

Response to #5 – Refer to answer # 2 and at no time did objections regarding intercepting firearms raised to Supervisor.

Allegation #6 – That "The supervisors instructed them to simply record the straw purchases in a database, flag them as "suspect," and monitor the suspected gun runners until evidence piled up about their connections to Mexican drug lords".

Response to #6 - The question seems to connote that ATF can promulgate a "No Sell" list like a "No Fly List", under which FLLs would be prohibited from selling any guns to any person on the list. ATF has no such power and ATF cannot interfere with the operation of commerce and prohibit a gun store from making a lawful sale to lists of suspects based upon nothing more than mere suspicion. These lists might well be long and would curtail a person's rights to purchase arms without any due process.

How is it that a person becomes a suspect in a straw purchase investigation? If they are buying multiple handguns, it could be because of multiple sales reports to ATF, notifying the bureau that a suspect is buying large quantities of handguns. If they are buying only long guns, they may not become a suspect until guns they have purchased can be traced after being recovered at a crime scene, or an FFL voluntarily notifies ATF of an unusually large purchase. But a multiple purchase by itself, or the recovery of a firearm at a crime scene does not establish that the original buyer of the gun is an "unlawful straw purchaser." If it did, then when a person buys a gun and then decides they don't shoot it well, or it recoils too much, or they really can't afford the ammunition, and sells it, out of the paper, or a gun show, or to a friend, if the next owner of the gun commits a crime with it, the original purchaser would become a suspect as an "unlawful straw purchaser" and a suspect in a gun trafficking case.

And your question presupposes that ATF agents should never let mere suspects possess a firearm. Your question seems to presume that once ATF identifies a suspect, they can treat that suspect as though they were a "prohibited person", never again allowed to possess a firearm, regardless of the fact that they have not been convicted of a crime. If this were the case, ATF could stop any person they label a suspect and take any gun they have away from them.

Allegation #7 – That "the tactics employed in the Fast and Furious case were part of an evolving change in the strategic direction of firearms investigations".

Response to #7 - Chait memo 2010

Allegation #8 – That "In addition, ATF officials have so far been frustrated in efforts to persuade the White House to implement even a simple change in firearm sales reporting requirements to help detect possible gun-running at the border."

Response to #8 - Long gun reporting..

Allegation #9 – That "With direct blessing of ATF headquarters in Washington and supervision by the U.S. attorney's office in Phoenix, a special ATF strike force known as Group VII was given permission to let federally licensed gun shops continue selling weapons to straw buyers already linked to a suspected Mexican gun running operation".

Response to #9 – ATF Agents and Lawyers from the US Attorney's Office did not "encourage" any FFL to "keep selling guns to known straw buyers." In the two meetings with FFLs, attorneys and agents advised the FFLs that the Government cannot advise them to sell multiple guns or advise not to sell multiple guns. The FFLs were advised that those decisions were up to FFLs as are all decisions to sell left up to the FFL to evaluate the sale and determine whether it is lawful. In short, the FFLs were advised that the Government cannot advise FFLs to halt a sale that appears lawful and we cannot authorize a sale that appears unlawful. There was no mistake as to the clarity of the Agents' and Attorneys' message.

FFLs need no encouragement to sell guns as that is their actual business, selling guns. By the time that the government met with the owners, they had made many multiple sales and the guns were gone.

The FFLs wanted to know that the information that they provided was actually useful, and that they were not unwittingly implicating themselves in some criminal activity of which they weren't aware. As we have said so many times before, they were told that ATF could not authorize illegal sales to be made any more than they could prohibit lawful sales, however, ATF appreciated their cooperation and willingness to voluntarily provide information to ATF including notice of multiple long gun purchases and notice of single gun sales of certain types of firearm or sales to particular individuals. No one discussed civil liability. The FFLs were providing information to ATF regarding transactions that the FFL must have viewed as lawful, having no knowledge or reason to know that the transfers were unlawful.]

Memos from AUSA(b) (7)(C) egarding meetings with (9)(7)(D) Memo # 1 dated 01/28/2011) & SGC (Memo # 2, dated 03/02/2011.)

Allegation #10—That "Officials told the Center that ATF allowed about 1,765 firearms over the 15 months of the operation to pass from gun dealers to the suspected straw buyers that were the accomplices of the gun running ring. Another 233 weapons had been bought by the suspects prior to the ATF operation starting, bringing the total number of guns in the case to 1,998".

Response to #10 – See response # 1. Clarity; we do not "allow" firearms sales, it is a legal/lawful sale. Deny 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment right requires legal authority...ATF has no such "no fly list."

ATF identifies the sale after the transaction as opposed to "allowing" sale during/prior to transaction.

Allegation #11 – That "Of those, 797 of the guns were eventually recovered as a result of criminal activity on both sides of the border — including 195 from inside Mexico — after they were used in crimes, collected during arrests, or interdicted through other law enforcement operations, the officials told the Center".

Response to #11 – Question vs. Statement

Allegation #12 – That "ATF is attempting to not only secure a straw purchase/dealing in firearms without a license case against various individuals but more specifically to make the bigger connection to the Mexican Cartel/Drug Trafficking Organization (DTO) obtaining these firearms for the best possible case and the most severe charges when it is time to Indict this case," the memo read.

Response to #12 – The ultimate goal which is part of Arizona OCDETF Strike Force Goal/Mission – Disrupt & Dismantle FTO to Sinaloa Cartel.

Allegation #13 – That 'said his supervisors seemed pleased when one of the guns the agency had let "walk" showed up in a crime in Mexico. They were "elated every time a gun was recovered in Mexico" because they "saw it as proving the nexus that we were dealing with a real drug trafficking group."

Response to #13 – At no time during Fast & Furious case were guns "walked." Elated is wrong word, we took it serious and followed up on every known firearm recovery in Mexico related to Fast & Furious. ATF took it very seriously as these recovery incidents were critical to understanding the complexity of the FTO.

Allegation #14 – "But the investigation dragged on for 15 months, in part, documents show, because the Justice Department was slow to approve a wiretap and bring prosecutions. Memos reveal that ATF supervisors were frustrated by the delays, but let straw buyers and suspected gun runners continue to move scores, even hundreds of guns a month, internal agency memos show".

Response #14 – As the suspects in the investigation routinely kept changed their telephones which caused agents identify these new numbers and submit additional affidavits. This is a time consuming process.

Allegation #15 – That "An April 2, 2010 memo from the strike force leader to the Justice Department disclosed that ATF watched as targeted suspects purchased 359 guns in the United States in March 2010 alone. The case summary sent to ATF headquarters in summer 2010 gave a much higher number."

Response to #15 – Not "Memo", (b) e-mail see attachment

Allegation #16 - "Nothing happened. We're monitoring the same buyers buying the same guns from the same dealers at the same rate and we're not stopping any of it," (b) (7) recalled.

Response to #16 – PJC building case, goal of case – disrupt/dismantle entire organization, complex investigation. OIG findings regarding low level straw purchase cases.

Allegation #17 – That "Notations in the case files reviewed by the Center show ATF received several "trace" reports of guns they had let pass to straw buyers showing up in criminal cases in Mexico or on the U.S. side of the border."

Response to #17 – Inaccurate...we did not "let guns pass."

Allegation #18 - That "In November 2009, for example, four 7.62 caliber weapons were recovered in Naco, Mexico only two weeks after one of the suspects had purchased them. Also, in July 2010 a Romanian AK-47 variant was recovered in Navojoa, Mexico, the records say."

Response to #18 - Naco siezure

Allegation #19 – That (b) (7)(C) who told the Center he expects to be fired for speaking out, said four of the seven agents on the strike force had strong reservations about what they were being instructed to do. The three others, he said, backed the approach (b) (7)(C) biggest fear was that some of the guns would eventually be used against law enforcement."

Response to #19 - no question

Allegation #20 – That "In May 2010, a Customs and Border Protection agent confronted an armed band of gangsters along the U.S. side of the border. The suspects fled but some of the guns they left behind were traced back to weapons purchased by one of the suspects targeted in Fast and Furious (b) (7)(C) said."

Response to #20 – See attached ROI…?

Allegation #21 – That "Then in December, two weapons recovered at the scene of a murdered Customs and Border Protection agent, Brian Terry, were traced to the ATF operation, according to Sen.Grassley."

Response to #21 - no response

Allegation #22 – That "The ATF said in a statement today that neither gun recovered at the scene appears to be the weapon that killed Terry, and they may simply have been left behind by the criminals. "At this time, we're not aware of any forensic evidence that would link these guns to the homicide," the agency said."

Response to #22 -Speaks for self.

Allegation #23 – That "The ATF clearly had plenty of information on the bad guys. The problem wasn't the fact that the guns weren't being reported, it was that the ATF didn't act on the information they had," the senator said."

Response to #23 – PJC memo on legal authority...

Allegation #24 – That (7)(C) said he feels responsible for Terry's death by being part of the ATF operation. He said he saw no other option but to go public — even if meant being fired — because he and his fellow agents' concerns were ignored by supervisors."

Response to #24 – no response

Allegation #25 – That (b) (7)(C) aid after his supervisors rejected the agents' concerns, he filed a whistleblower complaint both by Web and phone to the Justice inspector general but was never contacted."

Response to #25 – never received objections directly from agents in group. ASAC Gillett and had meeting regarding schism. At neither time were these issues raised.

Allegation #26 – That "He then approached Grassley, keeping his current supervisor on a joint terrorism task force apprised of his whistleblowing activities."

Response to #26 – FBI Supervisor denies...

Allegation #27 – That "Eventually, the inspector general contacted (b) (7)(C) fter Grassley intervened."

Response to #27 - No response

Allegation #28 – That "ATF supervisors told agents who disagreed with the strategy that "if you are going to make an omelet you've got to scramble some eggs, (b) (7)(C) said. "That was the attitude. I took it to mean that whatever crimes these guns were going to be involved in, those were the eggs, those were acceptable."

Response to #28 – No supervisor in PFD never recalls making statement.

Allegation #29 – That (a) (7)(C) said that another time a supervisor told him, "It's kind of a moot argument. They're going to get those guns somewhere.' But my feeling is we shouldn't be making it easier for them."

Response to #29 – No supervisor in PFD never recalls making statement. PJC legal authority, mission/goal of case.

Allegation #30 – That "Internal agency memos show ATF supervisors dismissed the objections of agents in the Group VII strike force, insisting the prize of getting permission to run a wiretap and eventually rolling up a major gun or drug gang in Mexico merited the risks. There were even comments interpreted by the agents as veiled threats that they could lose their jobs if they didn't fall in line.

"This is a time we all need to pull together, not drift apart," Group VII supervisor (b) (7)(c) wrote to his strike force team in March 2010, acknowledging "there may be a schism developing amongst the group."

"If you don't think this is fun you're in the wrong line of work — period! This is the pinnacle of domestic U.S. law enforcement techniques. After this the tool box is empty, (b) (7) wrote.

"Maybe the Maricopa County Jail is hiring detention officers and you can get paid \$30,000 (instead of \$100,000) to serve lunch to inmates all day."

Response to #30 – see attached e-mail, not "prize" it is a investigative technique after all other investigative techniques have been exhausted.

Allegation #31 – That "By spring 2010 pepaled to the Justice Department for some "urgency" as the number of weapons ATF let through was growing.

In an April 2, 2010, email to one of his supervisors and an assistant U.S. attorney in Phoenix (b) (7) wrote there was "no pressure but perhaps an increased sense of urgency." The strike force supervisor noted that March 2010 was deadliest month in five years in Mexico and also yielded some of the largest movement of weapons from Fast and Furious.

"Our subjects purchased 359 firearms during the month of March alone, to include numerous Barrett .50 caliber rifles. (b) (7) vrote. "I believe we are righteous in our plan to dismantle this entire organization and to rush in to arrest any one person without taking into account the entire scope of the conspiracy would be ill advised to the overall good of the mission.

"I acknowledge that we are all in agreement that to do so properly requires patience and planning. In the event, however, that there is anything we can do to facilitate a timely response or turnaround by others, we should communicate our sense of urgency with regard to this matter."

Response to #31 – Not "Memo" (b) (7) e-mail see attachment

Allegation #32 – That "When asked for comment on the office's role in the ATF operation, a spokesman for the U.S. attorney's office in Phoenix noted today that federal prosecutors along the Mexican border have been pressing for tougher penalties against straw buyers who traffic arms to Mexico."

Response to #32 - No response

Allegation #33 – That "William Newell, special agent in charge of the ATF's Phoenix office, announces the indictments that emerged from the Fast and Furious investigation on Jan. 25 in Phoenix. ATF officials say Newell is slated to become the agency's new attaché to the Mexican government."

Response to #33 – Effective May 8, 2010 PFD SAC Newell

Allegation #34 – That (b) (7)(c) aid some of the cooperating gun dealers who sold weapons to the suspects at ATF's behest initially had concerns and wanted to end their sales. One even asked whether the dealers might have a legal liability, but was assured by federal prosecutors they would be protected, he said. The case logs show ATF supervisors and U.S. attorney's office lawyers met with some of the gun dealers to discuss their "role" in the case, in one instance as far back as December 2009. Concerns about ATF's approach even extended outside the ATF office in Phoenix."

Response to #34 – Two memos from AUSA(b) (7)(C) regarding meetings with (b) (7)(D)

Allegation #35 – That "Grassley's office said it has gathered evidence and testimony that (7)(C) the ATF's then-attache to the Mexican government in Mexico City, also objected to the Fast and Furious strategy. He worried it might be viewed by the administration of Mexican president Felipe Calderon as a misguided approach that only armed drug lords for more violence.

The attache, Grassley said, raised his objections to ATF headquarters but was told supervisors there already knew about the operation as eventually removed from his job, and retired. His planned replacement is the special agent-in-charge in Phoenix during the operation, William Newell, ATF officials said.

leclined to be interviewed."

Response to #35 - no response

Allegation #36 – "What other factors might have influenced ATF to let guns "walk" rather than confiscating them immediately and arresting the straw buyers?"

Response to #36 - We never let guns "walk." PJC legal authority

Allegation #37 – That "Part of the answer may lie in the sort of frustration experienced by ATF in an earlier Phoenix case against firearms dealer (b) (7)(C) who owned a store called X Caliber Guns. Dozens of Romanian WASR 10 weapons bought by suspected straw buyers at X Caliber were eventually recovered at Mexican crime scenes, but authorities could not make a successful case against Iknadosian in 2009, alleging that he was part of a conspiracy trafficking firearms to Mexico. Federal prosecutors declined to take the case because federal courts were increasingly ruling that purchasers had to be barred from buying weapons in order for a dealer to be prosecuted. State prosecutors stepped in and charged Iknadosian with fraud, conspiracy and money laundering, but a state judge dismissed the case, using similar logic as the federal courts."

Response to #37 - Not allegation....statement or opinion...????

Allegation #38 – That "ATF officials were also facing a Justice Department inspector general's review of Operation Gun Runner — a review which ultimately criticized the agency in November 2010 for not aiming higher in its border gun probes. "ATF's focus remains largely on inspections of gun dealers and investigations of straw purchasers, rather than on higher-level traffickers, smugglers, and the ultimate recipients of the trafficked guns," the report said. "Because there is no federal firearms trafficking statute, ATF must use a wide variety of other statutes to combat firearms trafficking. However, cases brought under these statutes are difficult to prove and do not carry stringent penalties — particularly for straw purchasers of guns," the report noted. "As a result, we found that [U.S. Attorney's offices] are less likely to accept and prosecute Project Gunrunner cases. And when these cases are prosecuted and convictions obtained, Federal Sentencing Guidelines categorize straw-purchasing-related offenses as lesser crimes."

Response to #38 – These quotes are from OIG Gunrunner findings.

Allegation #39 – That "Publicly, ATF and Justice have tried to downplay any notion it would let guns knowingly flow to straw buyers to Mexican drug lords. Newell, the special agent in charge in Phoenix, was asked at a news conference after the indictment whether his agency would ever let guns knowingly cross the border. Newell answered, "Hell, no." But, he said, suspects under surveillance sometimes elude agents, which could result in guns winding up in Mexico."

Response to #39 – PJC legal authority.

Allegation #40 – That "In a Feb. 4 letter to the senator, the Justice Department said ATF never "knowingly allowed the sale of assault weapons to a straw purchaser who then transported them into Mexico." ATF, the letter added, makes "every effort to interdict weapons that have been purchased illegally and prevent their transportation into Mexico."

Response to #40 - Accurate statement.

Allegation #41 – That "Grassley told the Center he now believes those representations are contradicted by the documents his staff has gathered and the testimony of agents like (b) (7)(C) The Justice Department and the ATF put up a wall to mislead the American people and were less than forthcoming," he said."

Response to #41 –

Allegation #42 – That (15) (7) (25) Iso believes his agency has been less than forthright, and said that was part of the reason he went public. "I'm boots on the ground and I've seen it done (let guns go through) and I had done it and I was instructed to do it almost every day I was down there. It happened," he said. "What we were doing in my opinion was wrong. It's not what we do and for my agency to openly and publicly come in and deny we are doing it, I can't even fathom it."

Response to #42 – Never let guns "walk" (785115-10. (b) (7)(C) case)

Allegation #43 – That "He was intentionally letting guns go to Mexico? "Yes ma'am, (b) (7)(C) told CBS News. "The agency was."

Response to #43 – Never let guns "walk"

Allegation #44 – That "An Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms senior agent assigned to the Phoenix office in 2010 (b) (7)(C) ob is to stop gun trafficking across the border. Instead, he says he was ordered to sit by and watch it happen."

Response to #44 - Never ordered to sit by see PJC legal authority

Allegation #45 – That (b) (7)(c) posses say that never happened. Now, he's risking his job to go public."

Response to #45 -

Allegation #46 – That "I'm boots on the ground in Phoenix, telling you we've been doing it every day since I've been here," he said. "Here I am. Tell me I didn't do the things that I did. Tell me you didn't order me to do the things I did. Tell me it didn't happen. Now you have a name on it. You have a face to put with it. Here I am. Someone now, tell me it didn't happen."

Response to #46 – Never ordered to do this

Allegation #47 – That '(b) (7)(c) and other sources say the gun walking strategy was approved all the way up to the Justice Department. The idea was to see where the guns ended up, build a big case and take down a cartel. And it was all kept secret from Mexico."

Response to #47 – Not accurate statement. At no times were guns "walking" to Mexico. PJC legal authority. SAC Newell to fill in Mexico portion...

Allegation #48 – That "Surveillance video obtained by CBS News shows suspected drug cartel suppliers carrying boxes of weapons to their cars at a Phoenix gun shop. The long boxes shown in the video being loaded in were AK-47-type assault rifles."

Response to #48 – See ROI # 238, CBS has unauthorized copy of item currently in ATF evidence as part of ongoing criminal investigation under federal indictment.

Allegation #49 – That "Documents show the inevitable result: The guns that ATF let go began showing up at crime scenes in Mexico. And as ATF stood by watching thousands of weapons hit the streets... the Fast and Furious group supervisor noted the escalating Mexican violence."

Response to #49 (b) (7) e-mail see attachment

Allegation #50 – That "One e-mail noted, "958 killed in March 2010 ... most violent month since 2005." The same e-mail notes: "Our subjects purchased 359 firearms during March alone," including "numerous Barrett .50 caliber rifles."

Response to #50 (b) (7) e-mail see attachment

Allegation #51 – That (b) (7)(C) eels that ATF was partly to blame for the escalating violence in Mexico and on the border. "I even asked them if they could see the correlation between the two," he said. "The more our guys buy, the more violence we're having down there."

Response #51 – Every effort was made where legally possible to prevent firearms trafficking.

Allegation #52 – That "Senior agents including (b) (7)(C) old CBS News they confronted their supervisors over and over. Their answer, according to (b) (7)(C) vas, "If you're going to make an omelette, you've got to break some eggs."

Response to #52 – No supervisor in PFD never recalls making statement.

Allegation #53 – That "There was so much opposition to the gun walking, that an ATF supervisor issued an e-mail noting a "schism" among the agents. "Whether you care or not people of rank and authority at HQ are paying close attention to this case...we are doing what they envisioned.... If you don't think this is fun you're in the wrong line of work... Maybe the Maricopa County jail is hiring detention officers and you can get \$30,000 ... to serve lunch to inmates..."

Response to #53 - Sec(b) (7) Schism e-mail attached.

Allegation #54 – That "On Dec. 14, 2010, Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry was gunned down by (7)(C) got the bad news from a colleague. According to (5) (7)(C) They said, 'Did you hear about the border patrol agent?' And I said, 'Yeah.' And they said 'Well it was one of the Fast and Furious guns.' There's not really much you can say after that." Two assault rifles ATF had let go nearly a year before were found at Terry's murder. (6) (7)(C) said, "I felt guilty. I mean it's crushing. I don't know how to explain it."

Response to #54 – "two assault rifles ATF had let go..." guns legally purchased on Jan 16, 2010, ATF was notified on Jan 19, 2010 3 days after the legal sale.

Allegation #55 – That "Sen. Grassley began investigating after his office spoke to (7) (7) and a dozen other ATF sources — all telling the same story. The response was "practically zilch," Grassley said. "From the standpoint that documents we want - we have not gotten them. I think it's a case of stonewalling."

Response to #55 – skip

Allegation #56 – That said they never did take down a drug cartel. However, he said thousands of Fast and Furious weapons are still out there and will be claiming victims on both sides of the border for years to come."

Response to #56 – Objective was to take down an organization that was supplying firearms to a drug cartel, this investigation accomplished this goal.

Allegation #57 – That "Late tonight, the ATF said it will convene a panel to look into its national firearms trafficking strategy. But it refused to comment specifically on Sharyl's report."

Response to #57 - skip

A. On the Status of F and F lead indictment, Avila:

Questions: Whether (b) (7)(C) s in custody, what's his plea, next steps?

#### Answer:

Under 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit law offenses committed by "straw purchasers" are not considered crimes of violence for which a person can be detained pending trial. As to the only other basis for pretrial detention – flight risk – (b) (7) s a US citizen and the Bail Reform Act requires the court to impose the least restrictive conditions that will reasonably assure his appearance and the safety of the community. Here (b) (7) vas released on conditions pending Trial by the Magistrate Court. His release conditions include reporting as directed to U.S. Pretrial Services, surrendering any passport, not traveling outside the district of Arizona, having no contact with the other defendants, and not possessing a firearm or other dangerous weapon.

Regarding the treatment of "straw purchasers" by the Criminal Justice System, the five Southwest Border United States Attorneys from Arizona, Texas, California and New Mexico recently sent the enclosed letter (pdf enclosed) to the United States Sentencing Commission urging that the prison sentences for "straw purchasers" be strengthened because of their role in the trafficking and illegal export of weapons." The letter states in part:

'As the chief federal law enforcement officers in the Southwest border region, we strongly believe the Commission must amend USSG § 2K2.1 if it is truly to address the national security implications of arms trafficking. As the Department explained during its meeting with Commission staff, straw purchasers are the primary source of firearms trafficked to Mexico from the United States. Most of the defendants prosecuted for arms export or arms trafficking offenses involving the Southwest border would not have obtained the firearms at issue were it not for the efforts of straw purchasers. Yet because straw purchasers face such low guideline ranges under § 2K2.1, and because many judges see straw purchasing as a mere "paper" violation, the sentences

received by straw purchasers fail to reflect the seriousness of the crime or the critical role played by these defendants in the trafficking and illegal export of weapons. Simply put, straw purchasing and illegal arms exporting go hand in hand, and both must be addressed together.'"

Regarding (b) (7)(C) plea and next steps, he has entered a plea of Not Guilty and the current schedule for the case is as follows:

B. On the issue of "sanctioning" or "encouraging" gun sales:

ATF Agents and Lawyers from the US Attorney's Office did not "encourage" any FFL to "keep selling guns to known straw buyers." In the two meetings with FFLs, attorneys and agents advised the FFLs that the Government cannot advise them to sell multiple guns or advise not to sell multiple guns. The FFLs were advised that those decisions were up to FFLs as are all decisions to sell left up to the FFL to evaluate the sale and determine whether it is lawful. In short, the FFLs were advised that the Government cannot advise FFLs to halt a sale that appears lawful and we cannot authorize a sale that appears unlawful. There was no mistake as to the clarity of the Agents' and Attorneys' message.

FFLs need no encouragement to sell guns as that is their actual business, selling guns. By the time that the government met with the owners, they had made many multiple sales and the guns were gone.

The FFLs wanted to know that the information that they provided was actually useful, and that they were not unwittingly implicating themselves in some criminal activity of which they weren't aware. As we have said so many times before, they were told that ATF could not authorize illegal sales to be made any more than they could prohibit lawful sales, however, ATF appreciated their cooperation and willingness to voluntarily provide information to ATF including notice of multiple long gun purchases and notice of single gun sales of certain types of firearm or sales to particular individuals. No one discussed civil liability. The FFLs were providing information to ATF regarding transactions that the FFL must have viewed as lawful, having no knowledge or reason to know that the transfers were unlawful.]

Main Justice position on the issue of Sanctioning or encouraging arms sales, the Quote of Assistant Attorney General Ronald Weich in his February 4, 2011 letter:

"At the outset, the allegation described in your January 27 letter-- that ATF "sanctioned" or otherwise knowingly allowed the sale of assault weapons to a straw purchaser who then transported them into Mexico—is false."

C. On the issue of "walking guns" or the timely seizure of guns:

Neither the USAO nor ATF was engaged in an effort "to let guns flow to straw buyers" or to "walk" guns that could have been seized under any lawful theory with available facts to prove the theory.

The guns flow FROM straw buyers and until agents observe illegal conduct they cannot treat them as anything other than ordinary buyers. At the time of transfer of the firearms from the FFL to the straw purchaser based upon the facts available to the FFL at the time of the sale, the sales to the "straw purchasers" are lawful; and seizure of the weapons in the hands of those purchasers without evidence of criminality would violate the United States Constitution and would be an unlawful seizure and deprivation of property rights without cause. (Fourth and Fifth Amendments).

In these investigations, there may come a point over the course of an investigation where ATF believes, though it is well short of proof beyond a reasonable doubt required in criminal cases, that they can prove that a particular person only buys guns for the purposes of illegal trafficking. However, seizure of the guns at that point may not be legal because purchasing multiple long guns in Arizona is lawful, transferring them to another is lawful and even sale or barter of the guns to another is lawful unless the United States can prove by clear and convincing evidence that the firearm is intended to be used to commit a crime. (18 USC 924 (d))

In short, the law does not permit agents to take guns away from anyone who buys ten AKs at a time solely because they bought multiple guns.

D. When weapons sales were monitored and those guns later turned up in crime scenes, had ATF somehow "authorized" the sales that ATF could have ordered stopped, or did ATF somehow not seize the guns appropriately or in a timely fashion?:

The number one concern for DOJ is interdicting guns that are unlawfully transferred to persons in the United States and in Mexico who will then commit crimes with those guns. The purpose of this investigation was to locate those guns, interdict those guns and bring those responsible for their unlawful purchase, transfer, finance and use to justice.

The full array of rights available to indicted defendants is also available to those persons suspected of committing gun crimes, and the government cannot violate legitimate gun owners rights by prematurely seizing their guns.

DOJ's goals of the investigation were two-fold: 1. Interdiction of the weapons that were purchased or possessed in furtherance of the unlawful trafficking conspiracy; and 2. Investigation with an emphasis on discovering other members of the trafficking organization, particularly the leaders of the organization who procure the guns from straw purchasers and have them smuggled into Mexico to the Cartels. There seems to be some misconception on the part of the press and members of congress that the minute that ATF

suspects that someone is a straw purchaser, agents can arrest that person and seize all of their guns. As explained above, that seizure would be unlawful, and ATF may only seize when a lawful basis for seizure can be proven under the US Constitution and statues passed by Congress.

The question seems to connote that ATF can promulgate a "No Sell" list like a "No Fly List", under which FLLs would be prohibited from selling any guns to any person on the list. ATF has no such power and ATF cannot interfere with the operation of commerce and prohibit a gun store from making a lawful sale to lists of suspects based upon nothing more than mere suspicion. These lists might well be long and would curtail a person's rights to purchase arms without any due process.

How is it that a person becomes a suspect in a straw purchase investigation? If they are buying multiple handguns, it could be because of multiple sales reports to ATF, notifying the bureau that a suspect is buying large quantities of handguns. If they are buying only long guns, they may not become a suspect until guns they have purchased can be traced after being recovered at a crime scene, or an FFL voluntarily notifies ATF of an unusually large purchase. But a multiple purchase by itself, or the recovery of a firearm at a crime scene does not establish that the original buyer of the gun is an "unlawful straw purchaser." If it did, then when a person buys a gun and then decides they don't shoot it well, or it recoils too much, or they really can't afford the ammunition, and sells it, out of the paper, or a gun show, or to a friend, if the next owner of the gun commits a crime with it, the original purchaser would become a suspect as an "unlawful straw purchaser" and a suspect in a gun trafficking case.

And your question presupposes that ATF agents should never let mere suspects possess a firearm. Your question seems to presume that once ATF identifies a suspect, they can treat that suspect as though they were a "prohibited person", never again allowed to possess a firearm, regardless of the fact that they have not been convicted of a crime. If this were the case, ATF could stop any person they label a suspect and take any gun they have away from them. This means that if you (1) bought two 5.7 mm pistols because you wanted one for the home and one for the office, or (2) bought three AR type rifles for you and your two sons to target shoot, or (3) you sold one of your guns to your brother in law, who resold it to a co-worker who took it into Mexico and got caught with it, then you are an "unlawful straw purchaser" suspect and the next time you buy a gun, with your own money, for a hunting trip, ATF should take it away from you.


E. Regarding the question "In regards to the guns recovered in Rio Rico after the Terry shooting, when they were purchased from (b) (7)(D), (b) (7)(C) was there surveillance going on in conjunction with Operation Fast and Furious, or did ATF only become aware after the fact and link it to (b) (7)(D) after the fact?"

Answer: There was no surveillance going on and the ATF did not learn of the sale until three days after it took place and the weapons were gone.

F. Regarding the LA Times and CBS News stories, they do not account for the fact, or rebut in any way, that this District is actively prosecuting unlawful weapons and ammunition traffickers.

In just two recent investigations in Phoenix, 51 defendants in 10 indictments have been charged.

In Fast and Furious announced on January 25 (Press release link below) 34 defendants in five indictments were announced. The trials are set for these dates:

To follow up on the discussion at today's meeting regarding EVault, please be advised that the team has met and devised the following plan of action:

- Our EVault administrator has identified the root cause of the outage that occurred yesterday as being related to the H drive. He is currently putting together the specific information as well as developing the corrective action(s) to be taken to ensure the issue will not persist. This write-up will be provided by COB today.
- The team will ingest the data relating to the 3 names that were provided by (b)(7)(C) into EVault today and monitor the process closely for any errors or issues. This will provide metrics for the rate of success and the risks that may be associated with proceeding using the product in its current state. The team will provide this information by COB today.
- The Operations Team will be focusing on resolving any issues with the EVault hardware, specifically the passive node in the EVault cluster which did not support a successful failover yesterday. Additionally, a dedicated (non-clustered) resource will be built immediately, to serve as another 'back-up' option.

#### **Mexico Training Details**

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Provides Firearms, Explosives Identification and eTrace Training — Mexico City, Mexico:

From March14-18, 2011, personnel from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives office will provide Basic Firearms and Explosives Identification and eTrace training to approximately 30 students from Mexican law enforcement agencies. An additional 60 students from SSP are receiving basic explosives identification.

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Trains Mexican Law Enforcement in Post Blast Investigation — Huntsville, Alabama:

From March14-18, 2011, six instructors from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) will conduct bomb scene investigation training for approximately 30 Mexican law enforcement officials at the Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville. This course will provide hands-on training by requiring participants to reconstruct components of an explosive device recovered through various investigative techniques. Mexican law enforcement and military officers and laboratory technicians will attend.

- Final Eric Collar Bomb Defendant Sentenced to Life Eric, Pennsylvania:

  On February 28, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of the final defendant in the Eric collar bomb trial in Eric. In November 2010, the defendant was found guilty by a jury for her involvement in the 2003 fatal "collar bombing" in which a person fitted with an explosive device around his neck was killed when the device detonated after he robbed a bank in Eric. The defendant was convicted on all counts and was sentenced to life plus 10 years to be served consecutively, in addition to a separate State sentence of 20 years.
- Life Sentence in Car Bombing Case West Memphis, Arkansas:

  On March 1, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of a defendant found guilty by a Federal jury in August 2009 for the bombing of a vehicle in West Memphis which resulted in serious bodily injury to a doctor who was the Chairman of the Arkansas State Medical Board. The defendant, a medical doctor, was found guilty on eight of nine counts, including use of weapons of mass destruction, possession of 98 unregistered grenades, possession of unregistered machine guns, conspiracy to obstruct justice, and obstruction of justice. The defendant was sentenced to life in prison for the use of weapons of mass destruction and an additional 40 years on all other charges.
- Armed Career Criminal Sentenced to Life Plus 5 Years Charleston, South Carolina: On February 28, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of a defendant to life in prison plus 5 years on Federal firearms

and narcotics violations. The defendant was convicted on all counts in a Federal trial in September 2010. The defendant has an extensive criminal history and is both an Armed Career Criminal and a Career Offender. This case was investigated by ATF, the North Charleston Police Department, and the Charleston Police Department.

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and Colombian Military Counter Intelligence Unit Examine Seized Firearms — Santander, Colombia:

On March 2, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported that personnel from ATF's Colombia office examined 1,325 firearms in Santander, Colombia with the Colombian Military Counter Intelligence Unit. This was the second of ten planned inspections of army firearm repositories located throughout Colombia. All firearms data will be sent to the ATF National Tracing Center and information will be shared with other U.S government agencies. Appropriate information will be forwarded to ATF field divisions for further investigations.

On April 4, 2011, at approximately I I:30 AM, members of the Keokuk, Iowa Sheriff's Office went to 18327 249th Street, Sigountey, Iowa to interview Jeff KRIER in reference to a shots fired call over the previous weekend.

Sheriff Jeff Shipley, Chief Deputy (b) (7)(C) and Deputy pulled into the driveway of KRIER'S residence and called for him to come outside. Shortly thereafter, the officers observed KRIER through a window with a firearm - When KRIER was challenged, he immediately opened fire on the officers

Sheriff Shipley and Deputies (b) (7)(C) and engaged KRIER in a gun baffle for approximately forty-five minutes. The officer's were in contact with responding officers and advised them not to come up the driveway until a tactical team was available as there was no cover - Once the first tactical team arrived they were attempting to come up the driveway when they were met by Sheriff Shipley and Deputy(b) (7)(C) ho advised them that Deputy was killed by a gunshot wound to the head. A standoff then ensued for approximately three hours.


As Iowa State Patrol Crisis Negotiators were talking with KRIER he exited his residence armed with a Ruger 9 mm pistol, a Springfield .30-06 bolt action rifle and a Remington 870 12 gauge shotgun and began firing at law enforcement. The Iowa State Patrol Tactical Team returned fire fatally injuring KRIER

KRIER had an extensive history with the Keokuk County Sheriff's Office. He was found not guilty by reason of insanity to charges in 1997 and convicted of assault on a police officer' in 1999. KRIER had also been recently released from psychiatric care less than one month ago.

Agents from the Des Moines Field Office responded to the scene and assisted with processing the crime scene and facilitating the urgent traces of the firearms involved.







cal year 2006. The number of MET teams has sharply decreased, and those teams that remain are hampered operationally by limits on temporary duty funding and other restrictions. The Committee recommends \$30,600,000 for the MET program in fiscal year 2009. This increase of \$10,000,000 will allow DEA to begin the rebuilding of the MET program, both through the establishment of additional teams and by increasing the funds available for existing teams. The Committee continues to believe that the MET program should be focused primarily on methamphetamine enforcement.

ATF is responsible for enforcing Federal criminal laws and regulating the firearms and explosives industries. The combined efforts of special agents and industry operations investigators allow ATF to identify, investigate and recommend for prosecution violators of the Federal firearms and explosives laws. Additionally, ATF ensures that licensees are operating within established laws and regulations. For fiscal year 2009, the Committee recommends \$1,054,215,000, an increase of \$26,401,000 over the budget request.

Southwest border initiative.—The Committee believes that the Administration's Southwest border initiative is insufficiently balanced among the different types of border crime. Despite testimony and written materials describing an "iron river of guns" flowing from the United States into Mexico, firearms trafficking enforcement constitutes less than 1% of the Administration's requested initiative. This gap in the Administration's strategy impedes efforts to reduce the cross-border movement of illegal guns and, consequently, reduce violence in communities on both sides of the border. The Committee recommendation provides \$5,000,000 for the ATF to enhance Project Gunrunner and other efforts aimed at tracing and attacking firearms trafficking organizations operating in Mexico and the southwest border region, particularly in those cities along the border determined by ATF to have the highest volume of illegal gun trafficking.

Regulatory backlog.—The Committee remains concerned by the backlog of pending regulatory actions at ATF, particularly among explosives rules. ATF has testified that this backlog is due primarily to a staffing shortage among regulation writers. In order to address the staffing shortage and improve the timeliness of ATF's regulation development process, the Committee has provided

\$200,000 to hire additional regulation writers.

Restoring current services.—The Committee is disappointed that the Administration did not request sufficient funding to fully restore the \$36,744,000 in services and activities that ATF has discontinued in fiscal year 2008. The Administration budgeted for the restoration of less than half of this amount; the Committee recommends the restoration of an additional \$21,201,000 to allow ATF to rebuild to its full current services level.







Dear Secretary Clinton:

On March 4, 2011, Senator Charles E. Grassley wrote to you requesting basic information about the connection between Operation "Fast and Furious," conducted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF), and the December 14, 2010 firefight that claimed the life of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry. I understand that you have yet to respond and are likely to refuse Senator Grassley's request for information without a letter from the Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. This refusal is mystifying in its own right, given Senator Grassley's standing as the Ranking Member of that Committee. More inexplicably, your refusal stands in stark contradiction to the promise of transparency promoted by President Obama. During Sunshine Week last year, the President stated that he had "recommit[ed] [his] administration to be the most open and honest ever."

Given the gravity of this matter, this refusal is simply unacceptable. Therefore, I am joining Senator Grassley's request for any and all records relating to a meeting involving the then-U.S. Ambassador to Mexico Carlos Pascual with Assistant Attorney General Lanny Breuer, Mr. Breuer's deputy, and other officials in Mexico City in the summer of 2010 regarding "on-going investigations" related to Project Gunrunner and its "Fast and Furious" component. The records sought include meeting minutes, briefing notes, e-mails and cables relating to any such meeting or meetings that may have occurred from June through September 2010. Additionally, please explain in detail the reasons behind your refusal to answer the Senator directly.

Dear Attorney General Holder,

We write to express our concerns about allegations that the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives' (ATF) Operation Gunrunner may have been complicit in the illegal transfer of firearms into Mexico. According to media reports, the Phoenix-based program known as "Fast and Furious" intentionally allowed straw buyers for criminal organizations to purchase thousands of guns so that ATF could track them across the border.

We find it ironic that the government allowed guns to be trafficked into Mexico as part of a program designed to stop guns from being trafficked into Mexico. We are also troubled that ATF engaged in activities that may have facilitated the transfer of guns to violent drug cartels while simultaneously attempting to restrict lawful firearms sales by border-area firearms dealers. In December, ATF sought to impose additional reporting requirements on semi-automatic rifles, a proposal that we strongly oppose.

The program resulted in a large flow of weapons across the border to Mexico. According to the Center for Public Integrity, ATF allowed nearly 2,000 guns—valued at over one million dollars—to cross the border to known criminal organizations. As would be expected, many of the guns were used in violent crimes. Worse, two guns from the program were found at the murder scene of Customs and Border Protection Agent Brian Terry in December.

ATF's strategy to allow weapons to flow into the hands of criminals carried serious and obvious risks. More disturbing, however, is that ATF appears to have accepted these risks without due regard for the consequences

ATF initiated Operation Gunrunner after the Department of Justice Inspector General (IG) criticized the ATF's gun tracing ability. In a 2010 report, the IG wrote:

Despite the increased activity related to Project Gunrunner, ATF is not using intelligence effectively to identify and target firearms trafficking organizations operating along the Southwest border and in Mexico. Moreover, ATF's expansion of its automated system (eTrace) to trace guns seized in Mexico has yielded very limited information of intelligence value.<sup>2</sup>

In addition, there seems to have been little effective coordination between ATF and the Department as a whole. While guns continued to cross the border, the Department was apparently slow to approve wiretaps and to bring prosecutions. Internal ATF documents show that ATF's supervisors became increasingly concerned about the pace of the investigations. It was only this January, 15 months after ATF initiated the program and a month after agent Terry's murder, that the Department finally issued its first indictment based on evidence from the program.

We commend your request that the Department's Inspector General investigate these allegations. In the meantime, we ask that the Department respond to the following questions:

- 1. How many weapons have been allowed to pass to Mexico under the program known as "Fast and Furious"? Is the program still active?
- 2. Who at ATF Headquarters approved the program?
- 3. Who in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Arizona approved the program? On what authority did the Office approve the program?
- 4. Did ATF or the U.S. Attorney's Office in Phoenix coordinate the "Fast and Furious" program with the Department? Did the Department approve the strategy?
- 5. What changes or improvements has ATF made to its eTrace program and its ability to use intelligence to target gun trafficking organizations in general?
- 6. Does ATF view the "Fast and Furious" program as a success?

Thank you for your attention to this matter. We respectfully request that the Department respond to these questions by Friday, March 18, 2011.

Moreover, the allegation that the "Fast and Furious" investigation somehow caused a "large flow of weapons across the border to Mexico," is mistaken. "Fast and Furious" did not involve agents watching as guns crossed into Mexico. This investigation did not include any planned or attempted controlled delivery of firearms to Mexico. It was not part of the investigation to permit guns to pass through any Port of Entry into Mexico. Indeed, this investigative team was keenly aware of the difficulty in gathering evidence that is located or recovered in Mexico and the difficulty in conducting coordinated interdiction efforts south of the border. Simply put, illegal arms traffickers delivered those weapons to Mexico -- despite efforts by U.S. law enforcement to stop them.

Authorized users can receive firearm trace results electronically, search a database of all firearm traces submitted by their individual agency, and perform analytical functions. In the last year, eTrace has gained strong new features. eTrace now accommodates data in Spanish, gives translations, and allows users to better sort and search additional data elements and images to improve weapons tracing. In the next 24 months, planned enhancements

to eTrace will improve ATF's ability to monitor and map gun tracing data in real time and to share information with other federal agencies, as well as with state and local law enforcement.

Dear Commissioner Bersin:

Since January, I have been investigating the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) operation called "Fast and Furious"—part of the broader "Project Gunrunner" initiative. According to several agents, ATF leadership encouraged gun dealers to engage in sales of multiple weapons to individuals suspected of illegally purchasing them for resale to Mexican cartels. Specifically, I am seeking information on whether CBP officials had an opportunity to seize weapons from straw purchasers on two specific occasions.

First, on March 8, 2011, federal authorities indicted 11 defendants, including the Mayor and the Police Chief of a small town in New Mexico, for conspiring to smuggle weapons from the United States into Mexico. According to the indictment, on January 14, 2010, Blas Gutierrez and Miguel Carrillo were pulled over near the border and were found in possession of eight weapons, including three AK-47-type pistols. Also according to the indictment, two of the weapons were later smuggled to Mexico, where they were found this month, March 2011.<sup>3</sup> I understand that CBP may have been the agency that conducted the vehicle stop referenced in the indictment and that some of the weapons may have been connected to Operation Fast and Furious. However, CBP allegedly let the individuals go, perhaps because it failed to determine that the weapons or individuals were connected to ATF operation at the time of the vehicle stop.

Second, CBP officials allegedly stopped Jaime Avila near the border in the spring or summer of 2010. He allegedly had the two WASR-10 rifles in his possession that were later found at the scene of Agent Brian Terry's murder, along with over thirty additional weapons. CBP officials contacted ATF or an Assistant United States Attorney who allegedly instructed CBP to allow Avila proceed without seizing the weapons.

#### **Mexico Training Details**

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Provides Firearms, Explosives Identification and eTrace Training — Mexico City, Mexico:

From March14-18, 2011, personnel from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives office will provide Basic Firearms and Explosives Identification and eTrace training to approximately 30 students from Mexican law enforcement agencies. An additional 60 students from SSP are receiving basic explosives identification.

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Trains Mexican Law Enforcement in Post Blast Investigation — Huntsville, Alabama:

From March14-18, 2011, six instructors from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) will conduct bomb scene investigation training for approximately 30 Mexican law enforcement officials at the Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville. This course will provide hands-on training by requiring participants to reconstruct components of an explosive device recovered through various investigative techniques. Mexican law enforcement and military officers and laboratory technicians will attend.

- Final Erie Collar Bomb Defendant Sentenced to Life Erie, Pennsylvania: On February 28, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of the final defendant in the Erie collar bomb trial in Erie. In November 2010, the defendant was found guilty by a jury for her involvement in the 2003 fatal "collar bombing" in which a person fitted with an explosive device around his neck was killed when the device detonated after he robbed a bank in Erie. The defendant was convicted on all counts and was sentenced to life plus 10 years to be served consecutively, in addition to a separate State sentence of 20 years.
- Life Sentence in Car Bombing Case West Memphis, Arkansas:
  On March 1, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of a defendant found guilty by a Federal jury in August 2009 for the bombing of a vehicle in West Memphis which resulted in serious bodily injury to a doctor who was the Chairman of the Arkansas State Medical Board. The defendant, a medical doctor, was found guilty on eight of nine counts, including use of weapons of mass destruction, possession of 98 unregistered grenades, possession of unregistered machine guns, conspiracy to obstruct justice, and obstruction of justice. The defendant was sentenced to life in prison for the use of weapons of mass destruction and an additional 40 years on all other charges.
- Armed Career Criminal Sentenced to Life Plus 5 Years Charleston, South Carolina:

On February 28, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported on the sentencing of a defendant to life in prison plus 5 years on Federal firearms and narcotics violations. The defendant was convicted on all counts in a Federal trial in September 2010. The defendant has an extensive criminal history and is both an Armed Career Criminal and a Career Offender. This case was investigated by ATF, the North Charleston Police Department, and the Charleston Police Department.

• Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and Colombian Military Counter Intelligence Unit Examine Seized Firearms — Santander, Colombia:

On March 2, 2011, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) reported that personnel from ATF's Colombia office examined 1,325 firearms in Santander, Colombia with the Colombian Military Counter Intelligence Unit. This was the second of ten planned inspections of army firearm repositories located throughout Colombia. All firearms data will be sent to the ATF National Tracing Center and information will be shared with other U.S government agencies. Appropriate information will be forwarded to ATF field divisions for further investigations.

   On April 5, 2011, officials with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives' Firearms and Explosives Industry Division (FEID) will hold a major manufacturer round table meeting with the top 10-12 U.S. firearms manufacturers to begin discussing common firearms regulatory issues with the intent of promoting greater transparency and collaboration.

#### ATF ORDER 3250.1A - INFORMANT USE AND UNDERCOVER OPERATIONS

CHAPTERB – UNDERCOVER OPERATIONS SECTION 3 UNDERCOVER RESOURCES PARAGRAPH 42 ET.SEQ., UNDERCOVER MERCHADISE

#### 42. UNDERCOVER MERCHANDISE.

- a. Policy. It is ATF policy to use undercover merchandise as an investigative technique only after special agents have explored all possible alternatives and determined that using undercover merchandise is essential to the success of the investigation.
- b. Undercover Merchandise. Undercover merchandise is any tangible item purchased using agent cashier funds or acquired through other means for the purpose of sale, trade, or display in furtherance of an ATF investigation. This includes ATF property or other merchandise (e.g., Title II firearms, explosives, flashrolls, narcotics) that may be exhibited to a person and in which the proprietary interest does not change. Special agents shall exercise adequate controls and security in the use of all undercover merchandise.
- c. Acquisition. Before purchasing any undercover merchandise, the requesting SAC should contact another field division or the appropriate Headquarters division chief for assistance in determining if merchandise currently available in inventory would meet the needs of the division. If the merchandise needed is explosives, inert explosives, or inert explosive devices, the SAC shall contact the Chief, Explosives Technology Branch, to determine what items are available.
- (1) Agent Cashier Funds. Funds to purchase undercover merchandise will be obtained in the manner prescribed in ATF O 3251.1.
- (2) Approved Expenditures. In accordance with ATF O 3251.1, the expenditure of agent cashier funds is limited to specified purposes stated on ATF F 3251.3. Therefore, if undercover merchandise is to be purchased, funds must be specifically requested for that purpose.
- (3) Reporting Procedures.
- (a) Purchase of Undercover Merchandise. Purchase of undercover merchandise will be reported on ATF F 3251.2A, Report of Expenditures (for Investigative Purposes), and will include the date of purchase, identity of the seller, a detailed description and identification of items, and the amount of expenditure. Special agents will obtain and attach all paid receipts, invoices, etc., to ATF F 3251.2A.
- (b) Sale/Trade of Undercover Merchandise. Sale/ trade of undercover merchandise shall be recorded on ATF F 3120.2. The report shall include the date of the sale/trade; identity of the purchaser (suspect), if known (otherwise, nickname and/or description); detailed description, identification, and value of the items sold/traded; identity of the seller (in the case of informants, the assigned informant control number shall be used); and the amount of the sale and balance, if

any, of unsold/ untraded merchandise. In the case of a trade, the property acquired from the trade shall be completely described.

- 1 Cash Proceeds From the Sale of Undercover Merchandise. The proceeds of the sale of undercover merchandise are recovered funds and must be deposited in the General Fund of the Treasury when the investigation is closed. Special agents shall transmit these proceeds, through the field division office, to the Headquarters agent cashier with ATF F 3251.2. (Refer to ATF O 3251.1, subparagraph 13f.) The funds will be returned using a money order or cashier's check, made payable to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. Because the proceeds will be deposited to the General Fund of the Treasury, the payee will not be the designated agent cashier.
- 2 Retention for Evidence of Proceeds and/or Property From Sale of Undercover Merchandise. In instances where proceeds or property from the sale of undercover merchandise is retained as evidence, the retention shall be reported as contained in ATF O 3400.1A, Property Taken Into Bureau Custody. In these instances, ATF F 3400.16, Property Inventory/Forfeited Property Appraisal Report, shall be attached to ATF F 3120.2. If evidence is released by the court for ATF disposition or it is determined that the funds or property is not needed as evidence, it will be disposed of according to ATF O 3400.1A.
- (c) Retention of Undercover Merchandise as Evidence. Any undercover merchandise that becomes evidence in criminal investigations shall be documented and maintained according to ATF O 3400.1A.
- (4) Required Receipts. The special agent obtaining the agent cashier funds shall obtain a signed receipt in all instances when the custody of the undercover merchandise is transferred to an informant, police officer, or special agent. The informant may sign an assumed name, provided the receipt contains the informant control number. ATF F 3251.1 (exhibit 6) shall be used. Receipts shall be attached to ATF F 3251.2A.
- (5) Other. Acquisition of undercover merchandise from a local, State, or Federal agency, such as food stamps, tools, televisions, etc., for purposes of resale or trade by means other than through expending agent cashier funds must receive the SAC's prior approval. The authorized receipt of this type of undercover merchandise shall be documented on ATF F 3120.2, listing merchandise received and from whom it was received. The sale/trade of undercover merchandise acquired in this manner shall be documented as stated herein.
- d. Prohibited Merchandise.
- (1) The following items shall not be used as undercover merchandise: property subject to forfeiture proceedings, detained or retained property, evidentiary property, and property being processed as abandoned. Only property to which ATF or another agency has legal title shall be used as undercover merchandise.
- (2) Certain investigative and undercover situations require the use of "props." Before the use of a prop is approved, specific reasons for its use should be outlined via TECS message or memorandum. In all matters involving props, the request shall contain a detailed outline as to why this technique must be used and an explanation of what alternatives have been attempted or

considered. A showing or illustration to a subject to enhance the undercover special agent's role is one possible justification. Another would be solicitation of the merchandise by the subjects of the investigation. The U.S. attorney should be contacted before initiating this technique, and his or her policy on props should be covered in the request or notification. In addition, the U.S. attorney should be advised that, in some cases, it is preferable that the props not be detained in pending court action. Most U.S. attorneys will agree to accept photographs of the props and special agent testimony. The results of discussions with the U.S. attorney should also be covered in the request or notification.

- (3) No tangible property shall be used as a prop unless prior SAC approval is received. When items such as television sets, videocassette recorders, or other merchandise are used, the SAC may grant approval. The SAC should document the approval and notify special agents by memorandum. Verbal approval may be granted in emergency situations. The props must satisfy the requirement of this chapter.
- (4) The SAC may approve the following items as undercover merchandise: firearms, ammunition, explosives or explosive devices (including inert or dummy items), alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, counterfeit currency, or counterfeit official documents. If the field division does not have such props available in its inventory, then the field division may request the assistance of the appropriate Headquarters division chief.
- \* (5) If a specialized undercover prop is required from the Firearms Technology Branch, the SAC will issue a memorandum to the Chief, Firearms Programs Division, to request the prop from the Firearms Technology Branch's inventory. Likewise, requests for props from the Explosives Technology Branch will be submitted to the Chief, Arson and Explosives Programs Division. The SAC will be responsible for authorizing the use of the prop in the investigation prior to submitting a request to the appropriate Headquarters division. Certification and maintenance of all firearms undercover props and display weapons are the responsibility of the Firearms Technology Branch. \*
- (6) Situations that place special agents in a position of initiating contact with and offering contraband to persons who might be engaged in criminal activity shall be discouraged. Background investigations should be complete and accurate to clearly establish that the subject is predisposed to committing the violation. Exchange of prohibited merchandise/ Government-supplied contraband for currency will be authorized only in those circumstances in which the buyer is a felon, is documented as an active criminal posing a potential threat to the community, or plans to use weapons supplied by the Government for illegal purposes, such as armed robbery, armed assault, kidnapping, or murder. Buyers who have no criminal record, who are not suspected of being actively involved in other criminal activities, and who do not plan to use Government-supplied weapons for crimes of violence should not be targeted for the use of these investigative techniques. (Note: buy/bust.) RAC/GSs and special agents must ensure that provisions have been made to guard against the defense of entrapment (subparagraph 22f).
- (7) When conducting investigations in which consideration is being given to the use of narcotics (including synthetic narcotics or any substance that will be represented as narcotics) as props, the special agent shall place priority on establishing the elements of firearms violations under ATF

jurisdiction. This technique shall be used only in furtherance of an ATF firearms charge. The use of narcotics props creates extremely hazardous situations for undercover agents, informants, and cover teams because of the possibility of rip-offs and confrontations with armed suspects, especially in buy/bust scenarios. These potentially violent situations create an endangerment to the general public as well. Special agents shall not provide any amount of narcotics to an informant as payment for services or cooperation rendered. The use of subsistence money (or funds provided to facilitate the purchase of narcotics evidence) by an informant to purchase narcotics for his or her personal use will not be condoned. The following guidelines will apply to requests for the use of narcotics as props:

- (a) Special agents shall forward requests to the SAC as described in subparagraph 42d(2). The SAC will review the request to ensure compliance with the requirements set forth in subparagraph 42d(7), above.
- (b) The SAC may give authorization for the use of narcotics as props, except for the following two instances where the appropriate DAD(FO) will be the authorizing official:
- 1 When the situation involves providing samples of the narcotics (including synthetic narcotics or any substance that will be represented as narcotics) that the subject may ingest or leave with. The procedures for requests of this nature are described in subparagraph 42d(8), below. The use of narcotics props in these instances should be considered only as a last resort. Requests for such use shall document all other investigative techniques previously attempted.
- 2 When this technique is to be used during a home invasion investigation as defined in paragraph 52. (c) The SAC shall report significant/sensitive investigations, incidents, or involvements in which narcotics are used as props by significant activity report (SAR) sent to the Chief, Intelligence Division (with a copy also forwarded to the affected Headquarters division chief).
- (8) Only in extremely sensitive or complex investigations will approval be considered to consummate the sale of "prohibited merchandise" and allow the subject to leave for future contacts, arrests, or probable cause for search warrants. In these cases, the appropriate DAD(FO)'s approval is required. A memorandum or TECS message requesting approval will be sent to Headquarters. In emergency situations, the DAD(FO) may grant verbal approval without a memorandum or TECS message. After receiving verbal approval, the SAC will submit a memorandum or TECS message within 24 hours or the next business day confirming the approval and providing the information described in subparagraph 42d(2).
- (9) In any case where prohibited merchandise is used as a prop, especially where narcotics are used, special agents should attempt to contact representatives of other Federal, State, and local law enforcement agencies who may have ongoing undercover operations in the same area. Every effort should be made beforehand to avoid the possibility of special agents exhibiting prohibited merchandise to an undercover member of another law enforcement agency. This is particularly sensitive in the case of narcotics since Federal, State, city, and county law enforcement officers aggressively pursue these investigations. These contacts may be made discreetly without compromising the case at hand.

(10) Safeguards must be established to protect the safety of the undercover special agents(s) and the general public at the location where the reverse operation will occur, to include safeguards to protect against a "rip-off" by the subject. Every effort should be made to remove the undercover special agents(s) from the location of a proposed buy/bust before the arresting agents' arrival to ensure the safety of the undercover special agents(s).

- e. Refund/Merchandise Transfer Procedures. Special agents shall attempt to return any unneeded merchandise to the original vendor and obtain a refund. If possible, merchandise acquired from local, State, or Federal agencies will be returned and documented by memorandum. Receipts obtained for returned merchandise shall be maintained in the investigative file.
- (1) Refunds. Cash refunds shall be returned to the agent cashier fund.
- (2) Transfers. Undercover merchandise for which refunds cannot be obtained may be used in another investigation or the merchandise may be transferred to another office within the same field division for use provided such transfer is cost effective. Whenever undercover merchandise is transferred, the losing office shall obtain a signed receipt (ATF F 3400.23, Receipt for Property and Other Items (exhibit 10)) from the acquiring office. This receipt will be maintained in the investigative file. (Note: Property description on ATF F 3400.23 shall specify the item(s) as "undercover merchandise," a category of property that does not require attaching ATF F 3400.16.)
- (3) Disposition. When undercover merchandise is no longer needed in a field division, the field division tactical operations officer will retain the merchandise for 1 year. The receipt from the field office to the tactical operations officer will require an ATF F 3400.23, which will show that all unused undercover merchandise has been closed out of the investigative case file and transferred to the division for maintenance. The field division should advise the Technical Operations Branch and the UCB of the availability of the merchandise. Any storage costs incurred will be paid by the field division in possession of the merchandise. If after 1 year there have been no requests to use the merchandise, the SAC may authorize its disposition.
- \* f. Annual Review of Undercover Merchandise. By the end of each fiscal year, each field division's firearms instructor coordinator (FIC) will conduct an annual review of undercover props and display weapons maintained by his or her respective field division and field offices. The review may be conducted during the Property and Fleet Management Section's annual inventory of all ATF-owned firearms, which is completed during the period May through July. During the review, the FIC should examine any firearm(s) that appear(s) to be damaged or not functioning properly. The FIC will forward the questionable firearm(s) to the Chief, Firearms Technology Branch, for recertification or removal from ATF's inventory, using proper procedures. During this review, the FIC will also ensure that the undercover props and display weapons in the field division and field offices have been certified by the Firearms Technology Branch. \*





Twenty-five years after its creation, the OCDETF Program continues to pursue comprehensive, multijurisdictional investigations of major drug-trafficking and money-laundering organizations. OCDETF simultaneously attacks all elements of the most significant drug organizations affecting the United States, to include international supply sources, domestic transportation cells, and regional and local distribution networks. OCDETF combines the resources and expertise of its seven Federal agency members (ATF, the Drug Enforcement Administration, Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S. Marshals Service, U.S. Coast Guard, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and the Internal Revenue Service), in cooperation with the Department of Justice's Criminal and Tax Divisions, the 94 U.S. attorneys' offices, and State and local enforcement, to identify, disrupt, and dismantle the drugtrafficking and money-laundering organizations most responsible for the Nation's supply of illegal drugs.

ATF consistently participates in close to 30 percent of all OCDETF cases nationwide. Within the OCDETF arena, ATF maintains its focus on major drug traffickers who use firearms to further their trade and violate firearms-trafficking laws, as well as laws relating to explosives. As we are all aware, firearms often serve as a form of payment for drugs and, together with explosives and arson, are used as tools by drug organizations for purposes of intimidation, enforcement, and retaliation against their own members, rival organizations, or the community in general. ATF's jurisdiction and expertise make it a well-suited partner in the OCDETF Program in the fight against illegal drugs.

### All Special Agents in Charge

The OCDETF Program has achieved remarkable past successes against regional and national targets, as well as members of major Mexican cartels. The senior leadership of the Departments of Justice, State, and Homeland Security have recently re-emphasized their commitment to work with the Government of Mexico to dismantle the Mexican drug cartels that currently threaten the national security of our Mexican neighbors, pose an organized crime threat to the United States, and are the source of illicit drugs and accompanying violence in both countries. Firearms trafficking from the United States to Mexico contributes to the escalating levels of cartel-related violence and is of particular concern for law enforcement on both sides of the border. ATF plays a leading role in connection with the U.S. Government-wide efforts to stem the southbound smuggling of arms to Mexican drug-trafficking organizations.

The OCDETF Guidelines provide wide latitude for designating cases targeting the trafficking of firearms by criminal organizations associated with the Mexican cartels. Investigations principally targeting firearms trafficking, rather than the underlying drug trafficking, are now eligible for OCDETF designation, provided there is a sufficient nexus between the firearms and a major Mexican drugtrafficking organization.

It is not necessary that every OCDETF prosecution include specific drug charges but simply that every OCDETF prosecution must be drug related. That is, the specific charges may be weapons, explosives, or other nondrug violations as long as the targets have been identified as major drug violators and otherwise meet the OCDETF standards.

The goal of every OCDETF case is to continually work up and across the supply chain to make connections among related organizations nationwide. In particular, OCDETF participants strive to identify links to regional priority targets whose drug-trafficking activities have a significant impact on the particular drug threats facing each OCDETF region and, ultimately, to one of the international "command and control" networks identified as a CPOT (Consolidated Priority Organization Target).

If you have a firearms investigation against a major organization, including those committing acts of violence to further their drug-trafficking activities that have linkage to, or have the demonstrated potential linkage to, components and/or facilitators of regional, nationwide, or international drug-trafficking and money-laundering organizations, you are encouraged to contact your regional OCDETF coordinator. The nine regional coordinators and their locations as follows:

# Answers To Your Most Frequently Asked OCDETF Questions

Why designate a case under the OCDETF Program?

There are numerous benefits to OCDETF approval—of which the most important are as follows:

- Significant operational funding for your investigation, to include travel funding for you and the State and local investigators working with you
- State and local overtime for officers working on the investigation
- An experienced OCDETF prosecutor will be assigned to the investigation

What about gang investigations? Are they suitable for OCDETF designation?

Gangs are viewed no differently under the OCDETF Guidelines than any other drugtrafficking organization. If information developed as a result of a gang investigation reveals a valid connection to components of major drug supply or money-laundering organizations, then the investigation should be submitted for OCDETF designation. However, gang investigations that remain focused solely in the geographic area where the gang operates and that reveal no links to nationwide drug-trafficking activity—no matter how prominent or violent the gang may be—should not be submitted for designation as OCDETF cases.


What about local drug-trafficking organizations?

If it is revealed that an organization's drug distributors are receiving their supply from a larger, identifiable supply network operating throughout the region or in another region, the case may be proposed as an OCDETF case. Similarly, a case targeting numerous small-scale methamphetamine labs or lab operators in and around the State is NOT an OCDETF case. However, if evidence is developed to demonstrate that the labs are obtaining precursors from a source of supply outside the region, or even outside the United States, the case may become an OCDETF case. Similarly, even if the lab operators are purchasing their precursors from local-area convenience stores, but the convenience store owners are all receiving chemicals from outside the district or region and/or sending the proceeds of their chemical sales to foreign banks, the case may develop into an OCDETF case.

What is the role for small or rural cities and districts in the OCDETF Program?

Many of our small, more rural districts consistently make excellent OCDETF investigations because the U.S. attorneys' offices and the ATF agents assigned to the areas are committed to making all possible connections to individuals and groups along the drug supply chain. The majority of drugs in our local communities invariably come from supply components outside the immediate area. It is by concentrating our efforts on making the connections to those supply components,

and on conducting coordinated multiregional investigations of those components, that we will succeed in attacking the nationwide organizations. Moreover, by actively participating in these simultaneous, coordinated investigations, the small or rural cities and districts will continue to have a critical role in the OCDETF Program.

• *Project Gunrunner*, implemented in 2006 as ATF's southwest border strategy, works in conjunction with its domestic and international law enforcement partners to identify, disrupt and dismantle the firearms trafficking infrastructure of criminal organizations operating in Mexico and along the border.

- Though primarily a border strategy, *Project Gunrunner* has targeted and prosecuted firearms trafficking organizations in all parts of the United States, from Minnesota to Florida to all our border states, where ATF tracing data and intelligence has provided valuable leads in identifying individuals bent on providing guns to the cartels.
- Today, there are over 4,600 open *Project Gunrunner* investigations throughout the United States looking into the firearm traffickers that bring such violence to Mexico.
- Since its 2006 inception, ATF's *Project Gunrunner* investigations have seized in excess of 10.000 firearms and 1.1 million rounds of ammunition destined for Mexico.
- In December 2009, ATF deployed Spanish eTrace, which allows our Mexican law enforcement partners and other Spanish-speaking nations to enter information about recovered crime guns into ATF's National Tracing Center. eTrace allows law enforcement representatives to electronically submit firearm trace requests, to retrieve completed trace results and to query firearm trace-related data in a real-time environment.
- Project Gunrunner proves that valuable investigative information is obtained when all
  crime guns are traced. Numerous illegal purchasers have been found and trafficking
  networks investigated and prosecuted.
- Since 2009, ATF has tripled its *Project Gunrunner* personnel in Mexico which has increased its capabilities for intelligence sharing and scene response. As a result, the Government of Mexico is able to perfect additional cases and prosecute offenders.
- As part of ATF's Project Gunrunner contributions within the Merida initiative, ATF
  continues to train Government of Mexico officials in firearms and explosives
  identification, firearms tracing procedures, post blast investigations, crisis negotiations,
  and canine explosive training.
- ATF has partnered with the Government of Mexico to create the **Combined Explosives Investigation Team** (CEIT). This team is a deployable, bi-national unit composed of
  Mexican law enforcement officers, ATF Special Agents, and ATF Explosives
  Enforcement Officers. The team responds to, and investigates, the rapidly increasing
  number of incidents involving the use or recovery of improvised explosive devices
  (IED's) and Vehicle Bourne Improvised Explosive Devices (VBIED's) in Mexico.
- ATF personnel attached to the CEIT's are specialist Explosive Enforcement Officers (EEO's), physically located in various U.S. consular offices throughout Mexico. This allows broader coverage and a more rapid response wherever the scenes may be.

• ATF has partnered with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and the Government of Mexico to form the DC Arms Group. Based in Washington, DC, this group is a multi-agency effort to coordinate strategic efforts of the participating agencies.

- Further *Project Gunrunner* statistics, FY 2006 2010 (only that information coded as Project Gunrunner, not ATF as a whole):
  - o 2,451 defendants have been recommended for prosecution.
  - o 809 defendants are serving an average of 104 months in prison and an additional 260 are under the supervision of the court for an average of 39 months
  - o 300 defendants have been convicted and await their sentence.
  - o 1,573 defendants (64% of all defendants recommended for prosecution) faced charges related to firearms trafficking.
  - o ATF conducted 11,745 firearms licensee compliance inspections.
  - ATF Industry Operations Investigators (IOIs) identified 92,871 firearms that FFLs could not locate in inventory or account for by sale or other disposition. By working with industry members, IOIs located either the firearms or records to confirm the disposition of 76,436, or 82% of the missing firearms.
  - ATF's IOIs reviewed over 1.75 million firearm transaction records to both validate their correct and accurate completion as well as glean investigative leads regarding patterns of purchases.
- The cornerstone of Project Gunrunner is intelligence-driven firearms trafficking investigations. ATF gathers intelligence from FFL's, ballistic and forensic analysis, and tracing data, in addition to using traditional intelligence sources and methods. This information is shared with our partners from DEA, ICE, CBP, and our Mexican counterparts to form a multi-layered approach to disrupting firearms trafficking and drug-related violence.
- Project Gunrunner's objective is to deny Mexican drug cartels the "tools of the trade," which they employ to murder civilians, as well as political, military, and law enforcement figures, in order to strengthen their grip on the lucrative drug and firearms routes into and out of the United States. To this end, the Administration has looked to ATF to find solutions to shut down the firearms trafficking organizations affiliated with the Mexican cartels, and to reduce the violence associated with cartel activity on both sides of the border.
- Based on its combined regulatory and criminal enforcement authorities, ATF has the
  unique expertise required to investigate domestic and international weapons trafficking,

and the unparalleled capabilities and resources to develop actionable intelligence regarding the illegal trafficking of firearms and explosives.

• In April 2009, ATF developed the Gun Runner Impact Team (GRIT) initiative as a supplement to Project Gunrunner to aggressively target and disrupt groups and organizations responsible for the trafficking of firearms to Mexico. The GRIT initiative, designed to be intelligence driven and investigative in nature, focuses on investigating a large number of firearms trafficking leads based on trace information from firearms recovered in Mexico and information obtained from the inspection of Federal firearms licensees (FFLs). GRITs deployments to Houston in 2009 and Phoenix in 2010 involved surges in ATF personnel of 80-100 employees for 100-120 days.

# **Expansion:**

- In 2009, ATF established new offices dedicated to Project Gunrunner firearms trafficking investigations in McAllen, Texas, El Centro, California, and Las Cruces, New Mexico, including a satellite office in Roswell, New Mexico. ATF also added new Gunrunner teams in Phoenix and Houston and added 12 new industry operations investigators (IOIs) to Southwest border offices. In addition, a total of four special agents were located in consulate offices in Juarez and Tijuana, Mexico to provide investigative support to the government of Mexico.
- These new Gunrunner offices are based both on ATF tracing and intelligence data, and that of National Drug Intelligence Center (NDIC) data confirming Mexican cartel centers of activity in the United States.
- As of August 2010, ATF has 224 special agents, 165 IOIs and 32 support staff assigned to Project Gunrunner in the four contiguous Southwest Border States. ATF is currently staffing two new Gunrunner offices in El Paso, Texas and Tucson, Arizona, with plans for 2011 to open new Gunrunner offices in Sierra Vista, Arizona and Brownsville, Texas. Additional expansion plans for Mexico include the opening of three new offices located in Hermosillo, Guadalajara and Mérida, as well as adding additional staff to the ATF Mexico Country Office (MCO) in Mexico City.
- ATF has established an ES-1811, Country Attaché in Mexico City, Mexico. The SES-level Attaché will work closely with the AD and DAD, Field Operations, the Chief of the International Affairs Office, the Southwest border SACs, and others on matters pertaining to Mexico. The Attaché will significantly assist in developing overall strategies, goals, and objectives for ATF representation and operational activity in Mexico; conduct studies of criminal activities; and develop criteria for measuring and evaluating accomplishments, results, and effectiveness.

## Deployment of eTrace in Mexico

• eTrace provides for the electronic exchange of crime gun incident-related data in a secure Web-based environment. eTrace allows law enforcement officials to electronically submit their trace requests to ATF, monitor the progress of traces, retrieve completed trace results, and to query firearm race related data in a real-time environment.

- Over 50 countries around the world trace firearms through ATF, and approximately 30 countries utilize the full benefits of eTrace.
- In December 2009, ATF deployed a Spanish version of eTrace to Mexico. This will improve Mexico's law enforcement tracing results and will assist Mexican authorities in developing investigative leads in their native language.
- In addition, eTrace will enable ATF and Mexican authorities to timely share intelligence and investigative leads, and undertake joint action in the investigations of cross-border firearms traffickers.
- ATF continues to work with the Government of Mexico to make firearms tracing in that country more comprehensive, thereby ensuring the accurate tracing of all known recovered/seized firearms.

A. On the Status of F and F lead indictment, (b) (7)(C)

Questions: Whether (b) (7)(C) in custody, what's his plea, next steps?

#### Answer:

Under 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit law offenses committed by "straw purchasers" are not considered crimes of violence for which a person can be detained pending trial. As to the only other basis for pretrial detention—flight risk—[b)(7)(©) is a US citizen and the Bail Reform Act requires the court to impose the least restrictive conditions that will reasonably assure his appearance and the safety of the community. Here, (b)(7)(©) was released on conditions pending Trial by the Magistrate Court. His release conditions include reporting as directed to U.S. Pretrial Services, surrendering any passport, not traveling outside the district of Arizona, having no contact with the other defendants, and not possessing a firearm or other dangerous weapon.

Regarding the treatment of "straw purchasers" by the Criminal Justice System, the five Southwest Border United States Attorneys from Arizona, Texas, California and New Mexico recently sent the enclosed letter (pdf enclosed) to the United States Sentencing Commission urging that the prison sentences for "straw purchasers" be strengthened because of their role in the trafficking and illegal export of weapons." The letter states in part:

'As the chief federal law enforcement officers in the Southwest border region, we strongly believe the Commission must amend USSG § 2K2.1 if it is truly to address the national security implications of arms trafficking. As the Department explained during its meeting with Commission staff, straw purchasers are the primary source of firearms trafficked to Mexico from the United States. Most of the defendants prosecuted for arms export or arms trafficking offenses involving the Southwest border would not have obtained the firearms at issue were it not for the efforts of straw purchasers. Yet because straw purchasers face such low guideline ranges under § 2K2.1, and because many judges see straw purchasing as a mere "paper" violation, the sentences received by straw purchasers fail to reflect the seriousness of the crime or the critical role played by these defendants in the trafficking and illegal export of weapons. Simply put, straw purchasing and illegal arms exporting go hand in hand, and both must be addressed together.'"

Regarding (b) (7)(C) plea and next steps, he has entered a plea of Not Guilty and the current schedule for the case is as follows:

CR-11-126-PHX-JAT (b) (7)(C).

Motions Deadline -4/22/11 Jury Trial- 06/07/2011 at 09:00 AM

B. On the issue of "sanctioning" or "encouraging" gun sales:

ATF Agents and Lawyers from the US Attorney's Office did not "encourage" any FFL to "keep selling guns to known straw buyers." In the two meetings with FFLs, attorneys and agents advised the FFLs that the Government cannot advise them to sell multiple guns or advise not to sell multiple guns. The FFLs were advised that those decisions were up to FFLs as are all decisions to sell left up to the FFL to evaluate the sale and determine whether it is lawful. In short, the FFLs were advised that the Government cannot advise FFLs to halt a sale that appears lawful and we cannot authorize a sale that appears unlawful. There was no mistake as to the clarity of the Agents' and Attorneys' message.

FFLs need no encouragement to sell guns as that is their actual business, selling guns. By the time that the government met with the owners, they had made many multiple sales and the guns were gone.

The FFLs wanted to know that the information that they provided was actually useful, and that they were not unwittingly implicating themselves in some criminal activity of which they weren't aware. As we have said so many times before, they were told that ATF could not authorize illegal sales to be made any more than they could prohibit lawful sales, however, ATF appreciated their cooperation and willingness to voluntarily provide information to ATF including notice of multiple long gun purchases and notice of single gun sales of certain types of firearm or sales to particular individuals. No one discussed civil liability. The FFLs were providing information to ATF regarding transactions that the FFL must have viewed as lawful, having no knowledge or reason to know that the transfers were unlawful.]

Main Justice position on the issue of Sanctioning or encouraging arms sales, the Quote of Assistant Attorney General Ronald Weich in his February 4, 2011 letter:

"At the outset, the allegation described in your January 27 letter-- that ATF "sanctioned" or otherwise knowingly allowed the sale of assault weapons to a straw purchaser who then transported them into Mexico—is false."

C. On the issue of "walking guns" or the timely seizure of guns:

Neither the USAO nor ATF was engaged in an effort "to let guns flow to straw buyers" or to "walk" guns that could have been seized under any lawful theory with available facts to prove the theory.

The guns flow FROM straw buyers and until agents observe illegal conduct they cannot treat them as anything other than ordinary buyers. At the time of transfer of the firearms from the FFL to the straw purchaser based upon the facts available to the FFL at the time of the sale, the sales to the "straw purchasers" are lawful; and seizure of the weapons in the hands of those purchasers without evidence of criminality would violate the United States Constitution and would be an unlawful seizure and deprivation of property rights without cause. (Fourth and Fifth Amendments).

In these investigations, there may come a point over the course of an investigation where ATF believes, though it is well short of proof beyond a reasonable doubt required in criminal cases, that they can prove that a particular person only buys guns for the purposes of illegal trafficking. However, seizure of the guns at that point may not be legal because purchasing multiple long guns in Arizona is lawful, transferring them to another is lawful and even sale or barter of the guns to another is lawful unless the United States can prove by clear and convincing evidence that the firearm is intended to be used to commit a crime. (18 USC 924 (d))

In short, the law does not permit agents to take guns away from anyone who buys ten AKs at a time solely because they bought multiple guns.

D. When weapons sales were monitored and those gans later turned up in crime scenes, had ATF somehow "authorized" the sales that ATF could have ordered stopped, or did ATF somehow not seize the gans appropriately or in a timely fashion?:

The number one concern for DOJ is interdicting guns that are unlawfully transferred to persons in the United States and in Mexico who will then commit crimes with those guns. The purpose of this investigation was to locate those guns, interdict those guns and bring those responsible for their unlawful purchase, transfer, finance and use to justice.

The full array of rights available to indicted defendants is also available to those persons suspected of committing gun crimes, and the government cannot violate legitimate gun owners rights by prematurely seizing their guns.

DOJ's goals of the investigation were two-fold: 1. Interdiction of the weapons that were purchased or possessed in furtherance of the unlawful trafficking conspiracy; and 2. Investigation with an emphasis on discovering other members of the trafficking organization, particularly the leaders of the organization who procure the guns from straw purchasers and have them smuggled into Mexico to the Cartels. There seems to be some misconception on the part of the press and members of congress that the minute that ATF suspects that someone is a straw purchaser, agents can arrest that person and seize all of their guns. As explained above, that seizure would be unlawful, and ATF may only seize when a lawful basis for seizure can be proven under the US Constitution and statues passed by Congress.

The question seems to connote that ATF can promulgate a "No Sell" list like a "No Fly List", under which FLLs would be prohibited from selling any guns to any person on the list. ATF has no such power and ATF cannot interfere with the operation of commerce and prohibit a gun store from making a lawful sale to lists of suspects based upon nothing more than mere suspicion. These lists might well be long and would curtail a person's rights to purchase arms without any due process.

How is it that a person becomes a suspect in a straw purchase investigation? If they are buying multiple handguns, it could be because of multiple sales reports to ATF, notifying the bureau that a suspect is buying large quantities of handguns. If they are buying only long guns, they may not become a suspect until guns they have purchased can be traced after being recovered at a crime scene, or an FFL voluntarily notifies ATF of an unusually large purchase. But a multiple purchase by itself, or the recovery of a firearm at a crime scene does not establish that the original buyer of the gun is an "unlawful straw purchaser." If it did, then when a person buys a gun and then decides they don't shoot it well, or it recoils too much, or they really can't afford the ammunition, and sells it, out of the paper, or a gun show, or to a friend, if the next owner of the gun commits a crime with it, the original purchaser would become a suspect as an "unlawful straw purchaser" and a suspect in a gun trafficking case.

And your question presupposes that ATF agents should never let mere suspects possess a firearm. Your question seems to presume that once ATF identifies a suspect, they can treat that suspect as though they were a "prohibited person", never again allowed to possess a firearm, regardless of the fact that they have not been convicted of a crime. If this were the case, ATF could stop any person they label a suspect and take any gun they have away from them. This means that if you (1) bought two 5.7 mm pistols because you wanted one for the home and one for the office, or (2) bought three AR type rifles for you and your two sons to target shoot, or (3) you sold one of your guns to your brother in law, who resold it to a co-worker who took it into Mexico and got caught with it, then you are an "unlawful straw purchaser" suspect and the next time you buy a gun, with your own money, for a hunting trip,


E. Regarding the question "In regards to the guns recovered in Rio Rico after the Terry shooting, when they were purchased from (b) (7)(D) was started was there surveillance going on in conjunction with Operation Fast and Furious, or did ATF only become aware after the fact and link it to Lone Wolf after the fact?"

Answer: There was no surveillance going on and the ATF did not learn of the sale until three days after it took place and the weapons were gone.

F. Regarding the LA Times and CBS News stories, they do not account for the fact, or rebut in any way, that this District is actively prosecuting unlawful weapons and ammunition traffickers.

In just two recent investigations in Phoenix, 51 defendants in 10 indictments have been charged.

On March 21, 2011, the Acting Inspector General (IG) for the Department of Justice advised Acting Director Melson that the IG's Oversight and Review Division recently initiated a review of certain ATF firearms trafficking investigations. In a March 21 memo, the Assistant IG for the Oversight and Review Division stated that the review would cover the matter known as Operation Fast and Furious, and other investigations with similar objectives, methods, and strategies. On March 25, 2011, Acting Director Melson received the attached request for documents and information relating to the IG review of certain firearms trafficking investigations.

On March 28, 2011, AD Stinnett sent each of you instructions on how to respond to the March 25, 2011 document request. She also sent each of you a document preservation request relative to Operation Fast and Furious.

On March 31, 2011 the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform (HCOGR) issued a subpoena for documents related to Operation Fast and Furious and the FBI investigation into the death of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry.





On March 21, 2011, the Acting Inspector General (IG) for the Department of Justice advised Acting Director Melson that the IG's Oversight and Review Division recently initiated a review of certain ATF firearms trafficking investigations. In a March 21 memo, the Assistant IG for the Oversight and Review Division stated that the review would cover the matter known as Operation Fast and Furious, and other investigations with similar objectives, methods, and strategies. On March 25, 2011, Acting Director Melson received the attached request for documents and information relating to the IG review of certain firearms trafficking investigations.

On March 21, 2011, the Acting Inspector General (IG) for the Department of Justice advised Acting Director Melson that the IG's Oversight and Review Division recently initiated a review of certain ATF firearms trafficking investigations. In a March 21 memo, the Assistant IG for the Oversight and Review Division stated that the review would cover the matter known as Operation Fast and Furious, and other investigations with similar objectives, methods, and strategies. On March 25, 2011, Acting Director Melson received the attached request for documents and information relating to the IG review of certain firearms trafficking investigations.

On March 28, 2011, AD Stinnett sent each of you instructions on how to respond to the March 25, 2011 document request. She also sent each of you a document preservation request relative to Operation Fast and Furious.

On March 31, 2011 the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform (HCOGR) issued a subpoena for documents related to Operation Fast and Furious and the FBI investigation into the death of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry.

While the IG document request and the HCOGR subpoena are generally directed at the same investigation, they are distinctly different in their scope. To minimize the impact of these two document requests, facilitate production of responsive documents, and ensure the confidentiality of responses, we will combine them into one request and secure them electronically. (Accordingly, to the extent that AD Stinnett's March 28, 2011 asked for you to produce hard copy documents to her office, you can disregard that portion of her guidance). SYNOPSIS: Case-Related Urgent: Arms Trafficing

### **DISCUSSION:**

The United States Attorneys Office (USAO) for the District of New Mexico (NM) in conjunction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) with the support of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) [hereinafter "Investigative Agencies"] are engaged in a developing case targeting the Sinaloa Cartel for arms trafficking. On Friday, March 25, 2011, the Investigating Agencies are planning an operation targeting Sinaloa Cartel member/associate, Irving Enriquez, for firearms-trafficking. The Investigative Agencies plan to use two (02) undercover agents (UC's), posing as firearms traffickers to delivering forty (40) ATF "prop guns" to Enriquez or his associates (the "Subjects") near Las Cruces, New Mexico. The "fee" for these weapons has already been paid, up front, in the amount of \$73,000 cash. Twenty (20) of the firearms will be machine-guns. A short time after the UC's deliver the guns, agents will recover the guns and arrest Enriquez or his as yet unidentified associates who actually pick up the firearms. Regardless of whether Enriquez picks up the firearms himself, or sends a subordinate driver, agents will arrest him on March 25, 2011. The "prop guns" will remain under the control of the agents who will be setting up operational protocols early Friday so that the take down can occur within minutes of the firearm transfer from the UC's to Enriquez, or his driver. The ATF prop guns will not be permitted to go into Mexico under any circumstances.

## Background

On Friday, March 18, 2011, a UC posing as a firearms trafficker met face-to-face with Enriquez to discuss the unlawful black-market sale of firearms to Enriquez. The meeting took place in Santa Teresa, New Mexico. During that meeting, Enriquez ordered forty (40) firearms, including twenty (20) fully-automatic, AK-47 type machine-guns. The UC told Enriquez he would be able to deliver the entire order of firearms on Friday, March 25, 2011. The UC told Enriquez the transaction would take place at a truck stop located on Interstate 10, near Las Cruces, New Mexico. Enriquez agreed to these arrangements. The UC gave Enriquez the UC's cell-phone number so that Enriquez could contact the UC when he was ready to schedule the firearm exchange on March 25, 2011. Enriquez made it clear to the UC during this meeting that the firearms would be smuggled into Mexico. Enriquez reports to Jose Antonio Torres-Marrufo, who law enforcement suspects of leading the Sinaloa Cartel's "Hit-Teams" (assassins) in Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico. The Sinaloa Cartel is engaged in a 'turf war' with the Juarez Cartel.

On Friday, March 25, 2011, at approximately 11:00 a.m. MST, two UC's posing as firearms traffickers will deliver forty (40) ATF "prop guns" to the Subject (whether it be Enriquez himself or others). In total, the firearms consist of: 1) Twenty (20) fully automatic AK-47 rifles; 2) Ten (10) .308 sniper rifles, and; 3) Ten (10) 9mm semi-automatic handguns. The UC's will travel to the Love's Truck Stop near Las Cruces, New Mexico, in two vehicles. One UC will drop off an undercover FBI pick-up truck (the load vehicle) containing the ATF prop guns, and then enter the second UC's vehicle. Once the Subject(s) arrive, the UC's will provide

the Subject (Enriquez or his driver) the load vehicle's keys, and depart in the second UC's vehicle.

Once the Subject(s) depart the Love's parking lot, SWAT agents and marked police vehicles will stop and arrest the Subject(s). The load vehicle will be affixed with GPS tracking devices and a remote engine kill switch, to be handled by nearby agents. All of the ATF guns will be packaged in large wooden crates and placed in the load vehicle's bed without ammunition. An additional GPS tracker will be placed within one of the gun crates. The FBI Headquarters Air Wing, including a tactical helicopter (TH) and fixed-wing aircraft, will cover the operation. They have already traveled to New Mexico from Quantico, Virginia, for this operation. FBI SWAT assault elements will be loaded on the TH, and in three nearby fully equipped FBI Chevrolet Suburbans.

On Thursday, March 24, 2011, agents will place a GPS tracker on Enriquez's personal vehicle in order to assist surveillance agents should Enriquez decide to send a driver instead of picking up the firearms himself. Physical surveillance of Enriquez will begin early Friday morning. Agents will also monitor Enriquez's whereabouts by "pinging" his cellular telephone for location information. If Enriquez does not travel to the Love's Truck Stop himself to pickup the load vehicle, agents will arrest Enriquez as soon as possible, but obviously after the load vehicle is successfully taken down by FBI SWAT agents.

The USAO intends to initially charge ENRIQUEZ by criminal complaint with possession of a machine gun, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 922(o), 924(a)(2). Additional charges will be considered as the prosecution proceeds. Although this investigation involved several agencies it notably did not include Homeland Security Investigation (HSI). The FBI Special Agent in Charge in Albuquerque has determined that HSI involvement and notification is not necessary.

Strategy for Combating the Mexican Cartels

I am pleased to provide you with a copy of the Department of Justice Strategy for Combating the Mexican Cartels (the "Cartel Strategy"), which was approved by the Attorney General earlier this week.

The Cartel Strategy is a product of the Department's Southwest Border Strategy Group, which I chair, and which has been meeting for the last several months. The Strategy Group is vice-chaired by the Assistant Attorney General for the Criminal Division, and includes the heads of: ATF, BOP, DEA, EOUSA, FBI, OCDETF, USMS, as well as the Chair of the AGAC and the U.S. Attorneys from the five Southwest Border Districts. The Cartel Strategy resulted from an active dialogue among, and significant input from, the components represented on the Strategy Group.

The Cartel Strategy is premised on the notion that a large share of the violence, drugtrafficking, corruption, and other criminal activity occurring along the Southwest Border is perpetrated by a relatively small number of hierarchical criminal organizations. The Strategy Group believes that the most effective mechanism to attack those organizations is the use of intelligence-based, prosecutor-led multi-agency task forces, that simultaneously attack all levels of, and all criminal activities of, the operations of the organizations. The Cartel Strategy sets forth a blueprint for accomplishing this with the resources of the Department of Justice. By design, the Cartel Strategy is consistent with the National Drug Control Strategy and the National Southwest Border Counternarcotics Strategy, both of which guide the larger interagency efforts, and both of which DOJ played a significant role in drafting.

The Cartel Strategy is not a radical departure from efforts that are already underway in the Department. To the contrary, the Cartel Strategy articulates those basic principles that already inform the Department's most successful efforts against the cartels. It is anticipated that the Cartel Strategy will serve as a guidepost toward what types of activities the Department should

pursue going forward. The Department will measure future initiatives in this area by reference to their ability to further the principles and objectives set forth in the Strategy. Furthermore, the document will help advise those outside the Department – our non-DOJ partners in federal law enforcement, our state and local partners, and policy-makers at all levels of government – how it is that the Department of Justice intends to confront this pervasive challenge.

It is important to note that, although the Cartel Strategy was developed under the auspices of the Southwest Border Strategy Group, the Strategy contemplates vigorous enforcement activity by law enforcement agents and prosecutors, not just at the Southwest Border, but in every jurisdiction. As you are all well aware, the criminal activities perpetrated by the Mexican cartels are not confined to the Southwest Border, but rather extend throughout our country, and internationally. Effective implementation of our strategy to attack all elements of the cartels comprehensively and simultaneously requires that we attack them vigorously in whatever locale they may be found.

I would like to express my deep appreciation for the active involvement of all the components of the Department in the effort against the Mexican drug cartels. As a result of your hard work, talent, and dedication, we have already struck many hard blows against them. I am confident that, going forward, and with the courageous assistance of our partners in Mexico, we will be on the proper path toward achieving even greater successes in disrupting and dismantling these dangerous criminal enterprises.

It is a priority of the Department of Justice to disrupt and dismantle the Mexican drug cartels, bring to justice their leadership, and stem the growing violence and associated criminal activity perpetrated by the cartels, both along the Southwest Border and throughout the Nation. In order to maximize the efficacy of its limited resources, which are spread through numerous components of the Department, it is necessary that the Department deploy those resources pursuant to a single, coherent strategic plan, under a single coordinating body, the Southwest Border Strategy Group.

An essential aspect of the DOJ plan must be ensuring a productive partnership with the government of Mexico, as well as with our state, local, and tribal law enforcement counterparts. Equally important, we must avoid wasteful overlap and duplication of efforts with the activities of our other federal partners, particularly the law enforcement agencies at the Department of Homeland Security.

The following document sets forth the policy considerations that will guide the Department in this process.

# The Strategy

The Department will implement its Strategy for Combating the Mexican Cartels under the supervision of the newly-created Southwest Border Strategy Group. The Strategy is intended to be consistent with the Administration's overarching National Southwest Border Counternarcotics Strategy.

The Department's strategy will be executed through the proven mechanism of prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven multi-agency task forces, with the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Program serving the primary coordinating function. Multiple OCDETF investigations should continue to be linked together at a national level in coordination with the Special Operations Division (SOD), resulting in nationwide takedowns coordinated by SOD, on the model of Project Reckoning, Operation Xcellerator, and Project Coronado.

The DOJ Strategy's key objectives are to:

- Increase the safety and security of U.S. citizens throughout the United States by enforcing violations of federal law that have a particular nexus to the threats posed by the Mexican Cartels, i.e. drug trafficking, money laundering and bulk cash smuggling, firearms trafficking, and corruption.
- Reduce the flow of narcotics and other contraband entering the United States.
- Reduce the flow of illegal weapons, ammunition, explosives, and currency exiting the United States and entering Mexico.

- Strengthen Mexico's operational capacities and enhance its law enforcement institutions.
- Increase bilateral cooperation between Mexico and the United States on fugitive capture and extradition activities.
- Increase intelligence and information sharing among law enforcement agencies in the United States and with Mexico to achieve focused targeting of the most significant criminal organizations.
- Improve case building through interagency coordination, leveraging the expertise and authority of each investigative and prosecutorial agency.
- Maximize the effectiveness of prosecution by locating, arresting, extraditing, and trying all levels, including most importantly the leadership, of these criminal organizations, and disrupting and dismantling the organizations' domestic transportation and distribution cells.
- Coordinate enhanced enforcement initiatives to address "downstream" impacts on judicial security, court and detention operations, prison management and fugitive apprehension.

# **Division of Responsibilities with DHS**

Addressing the Southwest Border threat has two basic elements: policing the actual border to interdict and deter the illegal crossing of undocumented persons or contraband goods, and confronting the large criminal organizations operating simultaneously on both sides of the border.

Given its statutory mission and the resources it can bring to bear at the border, DHS clearly bears primary responsibility for the policing function at the border. DOJ fully supports DHS in that endeavor by sharing relevant intelligence and by prosecuting the most egregious offenders DHS arrests in the course of its policing function. The Department of Justice prosecutes tens of thousands of these reactive law enforcement cases in federal court every year.

However, the root cause of the explosion of violence just south of our border is the conflicts within and among a limited number of sophisticated, transnational criminal organizations. These hierarchical, Mexico-based cartels are responsible for smuggling into the United States most of our nation's illegal drug supply. While the cartels' primary business is drug trafficking, they also sponsor a panoply of other crimes that support their illegal operations. These other crimes include extortion, torture, murder, corruption of public officials, sheltering of wanted fugitives, kidnapping and human smuggling, laundering of illicit criminal proceeds through the existing financial system

and through bulk cash smuggling, and the illegal acquisition, trafficking, and use of firearms and explosives.

It is in taking down these organized, multi-faceted criminal enterprises that DOJ plays the primary role and brings to bear its special expertise. DOJ's success in this endeavor assists, in turn, DHS in the performance of its policing and enforcement function, by disrupting the operations of the cartels, thereby decreasing the pressure on the border. For its part, DHS, and in particular ICE, provides invaluable assistance to the attack on these criminal organizations, by bringing to bear its unique expertise on cross-border transit of contraband.

Border policing and interdiction, and the resulting prosecutions, are key elements of the U.S. government's overall border security strategy. However, the investigation, apprehension, extradition, and prosecution of key cartel leaders and their associates, and the deprivation through forfeiture of their ill-gotten gains, is the most effective means by which we can move past merely addressing the symptoms of our problems along the Southwest Border and attack, instead, the underlying causes.

# **Deployment of Resources**

The Department's view – based on its decades of experience in investigating, prosecuting, and dismantling organized criminal groups, such as the Mafia, international terrorist groups, and domestic and transnational gangs – is that the best way to fight large scale criminal organizations is through prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency task forces that blend the strengths, resources, and expertise of the complete spectrum of federal, state, local, and international investigative and prosecutorial agencies. Through their participation in such task forces, the Department's prosecutors, together with its component law enforcement agencies – DEA, ATF, FBI, and USMS – give the Department the capacity to carry out the full range of activities necessary to succeed against these organizations.

The Department has embraced a model to achieve these comprehensive goals that is proactive, in which we develop priority targets through the extensive use of intelligence. This intelligence is obtained from law enforcement sources, as well as through the careful and disciplined use of classified information from intelligence community agencies to provide unclassified leads. Sharing information, we build cases, coordinating long-term, extensive investigations to identify all the tentacles of a particular organization. Through sustained coordination of these operations, we are able to execute a coordinated enforcement action, arresting as many high-level members of the organization as possible, disrupting and dismantling the domestic transportation and distribution cells of the organization, and seizing as many of the organization's assets as possible, whether those assets be in the form of bank accounts, real property, cash, drugs, or weapons. Finally, we prosecute the leaders of the cartels and their principal facilitators, locating, arresting, and extraditing them from abroad as necessary. In this effort, we coordinate closely with our Mexican counterparts to achieve the goal: destruction or weakening of the drug cartels to the point that they no longer pose a viable

threat to U.S. interests and can be dealt with by Mexican law enforcement in conjunction with a strengthened judicial system and an improved legal framework for fighting organized crime.

In most places, along the border and throughout the country, OCDETF provides an effective mechanism for law enforcement agencies from within DOJ, from elsewhere in the federal government (including DHS and Treasury), and state and local law enforcement, to combine with federal prosecutors to form a "virtual task force" for the purpose of investigating and prosecuting a particular high-value drug trafficking organization. In certain key locales, OCDETF has established actual, brick-and-mortar Co-Located Strike Forces, for the pursuit of the highest level traffickers of drugs, guns, and money. For instance, the San Diego Major Mexican Traffickers Task Force has been responsible for coordinating the U.S. government's successful efforts against the Arellano-Felix Organization. The Houston OCDETF Strike Force has directed our most damaging blows against the Gulf Cartel. And in the first several months of its existence, the Arizona OCDETF Strike Force has been responsible for the indictment of a leader and other members of a major Mexican cartel and the seizure of millions of dollars in cartel assets.

The Department will use the OCDETF Strike Force concept to target <u>all</u> the organized crime activities of the drug cartels – not just those crimes directly related to the drug trade. By further leveraging and coordinating the investigative expertise and jurisdiction of law enforcement agencies outside the drug enforcement area, the Department will task the Strike Forces to disrupt and dismantle every area of the cartels' infrastructure and undermine their ability to operate successfully in any illegal activity.

On a local level, each Strike Force co-locates law enforcement resources that are supplemented by one or more on-site Assistant United States Attorneys. Retaining the current Strike Force structure, specifically the co-location and intensive and early prosecutorial involvement, ensures that the Department capitalizes upon the proven synergy of these Strike Forces to maximize the effectiveness of long-term investigations of these organizations. The synergy created by co-locating the diverse expertise of federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies with prosecutors from the U.S. Attorney's Office, has had demonstrable success against major criminal organizations operating throughout the country. It is for this reason that the Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General should have the flexibility to call upon and leverage the resources of the already successful multi-agency task forces around the country, including the OCDETF Strike Forces, HIDTA Task Forces, DEA task force groups, FBI Safe Streets Task Forces, and VCITs, drawing upon the expertise of all of the agencies that contribute to them.

In those locations where they currently exist, DOJ will make the OCDETF Co-Located Strike Forces the focal point for interagency efforts against the Mexican criminal organizations. Elsewhere along the border, and throughout the nation, DOJ will seek to

replicate, to the extent possible, the OCDETF Strike Force model, in particular the characteristics of interagency cooperation, information sharing, and strategic, intelligence-based targeting that have been embodied in these Strike Forces.

Supplementing the regional operations of the prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven multi-agency task forces with a comprehensive national policy and coordination body, the Southwest Border Strategy Group, run out of the Office of the Deputy Attorney General, will give the Department a unified and comprehensive vehicle through which the United States government can disrupt the influence of the cartels. This unified and coordinated approach to law enforcement is not only the best way to use the formidable resources of the United States government, but also the most effective way to decrease the influence of these violent criminal enterprises while enhancing the public safety.

While the prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency task force model is a key component of the Department's strategy, it will not be the only component. We must also recognize and support the important daily work performed by our investigators and prosecutors in stopping and seizing the massive amounts of narcotics, firearms, and bulk cash that flow across the border in both directions. These more reactive narcotics cases are important to the overall cartel strategy, because in the process we are seizing millions of pounds of drugs, thousands of firearms, and millions of dollars in bulk cash as they enter and exit the country. In addition, these commodity-focused cases yield significant intelligence that is then fed into the Special Operations Division (SOD), the OCDETF Fusion Center (OFC), and the El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC) for use in supporting more proactive, intelligence-driven investigations that are designed to attack all of the cartels' diverse lines of illegal business. Therefore, the Department's Strategy for Combating the Mexican Cartels must include an assessment of the resource needs of all our components, and a plan for how they intend to achieve the stated goals of the Strategy in light of the specific cartel activity impacting their jurisdictions.

### Intelligence

Law enforcement agencies must have the ability to access, link, and interpret voluminous intelligence information from as wide a community as possible. We use this shared information to identify and target the most significant organizations, so that we can achieve the greatest impact with our finite resources. We also use shared information to develop coordinated, multi-jurisdictional investigations of those high-impact targets, making sure that investigations are mutually reinforcing, without duplicating or jeopardizing other investigations targeting overlapping organizations.

Several multi-agency endeavors are particularly important to the provision of tactical intelligence and operational support in targeting the largest and most dangerous Mexican cartels.

The Attorney General's Consolidated Priority Organization Target (CPOT) List

The CPOT list of international "Most Wanted" drug kingpins will be used to help focus our critical resources on the greatest threats from the Mexican cartels. Of the 59 worldwide organizations currently on the list, 25 of them are Mexico-based. DOJ will also work in partnership with the Secretary of the Treasury to impose sanctions against Mexican drug trafficking organizations pursuant to the President's authority under the Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act.

# The El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC)

EPIC is a DEA-led multi-agency organization that provides case-specific tactical intelligence, focusing specifically on the Southwest Border. The ATF Firearms Intelligence Analysis Team is a specialized component of EPIC that serves as a central point of analysis and repository for all Southwest Border firearms-related intelligence. FBI recently created the Southwest Intelligence Group (SWIG), a clearinghouse of all FBI activities involving Mexico, and it is in the process of moving that clearinghouse to EPIC. EPIC houses the National Seizure System, which collects and maintains data on seizures of drugs, guns, and money by law enforcement agencies throughout the nation.

## The Special Operations Division (SOD)

SOD is a DEA-led multi-agency coordination center that targets the communication devices the criminal organizations' leaders use to communicate with each other. SOD actively supports multi-jurisdictional, multi-national, and multi-agency electronic surveillance investigations, coordinating overlapping investigations and ensuring that tactical and operational intelligence is shared between law enforcement agencies.

## The OCDETF Fusion Center (OFC)

The OFC is a comprehensive, multi-agency data center containing drug and related financial data from DEA, ATF, FBI, ICE, CBP, IRS, USMS, EPIC, the U.S. Coast Guard, the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network, the State Department's Bureau of Consular Affairs, and other key agencies. It conducts cross-agency and cross-jurisdictional integration and analyses to create comprehensive pictures of targeted organizations and to pass usable leads through SOD to participants in the field.

### Current Areas of Focus

Pursuant to the principles articulated above, DOJ is pursuing initiatives in the following areas:

# 1. Ramping up Establishment and Use of Vetted Units in Mexico

An important aspect of case building in Mexico involves U.S. cooperation with specially vetted Mexican law enforcement units. DOJ law enforcement agents work in an advisory capacity to develop elite vetted units of Mexican federal police officers,

training them to conduct law enforcement operations that lead to the discovery and seizure of drugs, guns, explosives, money, and documentary evidence to support bilateral investigations and prosecutions. The Mexican units also arrest active members of the cartels, who may eventually become either cooperating witnesses, defendants, or both. These units are essential to our operations. In order to properly leverage and support these crucial operations, the Department must expand their number, to include more drug trafficking units, a firearms trafficking unit, a money-laundering/financial unit, and a fugitive apprehension unit.

### 2. Continued Focus on Attacking Cartel Finances

A particular point of emphasis in recent years has been the dismantlement of the financial infrastructure of the drug trafficking organizations. These efforts have been hampered by the fact that financial cases are complex and time-consuming, and the pool of experienced financial investigators is finite. Since the curtailment of IRS involvement in drug investigations in 2005, ATF, DEA, FBI, and USMS have hired additional financial investigators and forfeiture specialists. OCDETF has established the Financial Investigative Contractor (FIC) Program to bring additional experienced financial investigators to bear on the largest cartels, and has buttressed the analytical and document exploitation capabilities of its Co-Located Strike Forces in San Diego, Phoenix, El Paso, Houston, and Atlanta. DEA has implemented Financial Investigation Teams (FITs) in its field divisions to target the financial assets of drug traffickers. Analysts and attorneys in the U.S. Attorney's Offices and in the Department's Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section have also stepped up their efforts to assist in prosecuting money laundering activities of all types. In addition, Southwest Region federal agencies are working with state and local law enforcement agencies on an OCDETF bulk currency initiative that targets the highest level drug cartels and their transportation routes in the Southwest. These efforts must be supported and expanded.

## 3. Attacking the Southbound Flow of Firearms

Addressing the flow of weapons into Mexico from the United States is also a primary focus of our efforts. ATF's intelligence has shown that the prevalence of firearms and explosives trafficking into Mexico has a direct nexus to the cartels' national domestic drug distribution network. Thus, given the national scope of this issue, merely seizing firearms through interdiction will not stop firearms trafficking to Mexico. We must identify, investigate, and eliminate the sources of illegally trafficked firearms and the networks that transport them. Since 2006, Project Gunrunner has been ATF's comprehensive strategy to combat firearms-related violence perpetrated by the drug cartels along the Southwest Border. Increasingly close collaboration between ATF and the efforts of the multi-agency drug task forces along the border, including, most particularly, the OCDETF co-located Strike Forces, ensures that scarce ATF resources are directed at the most important targets. Additionally, DOJ is sponsoring and hosting U.S./Mexico bilateral working groups focusing on joint efforts to combat arms trafficking, and is ensuring that U.S. Attorneys Offices around the country are coordinating on firearms trafficking cases.

# 4. Increased Focus on Locating and Apprehending Fugitives

Similarly, investigating and indicting traffickers will not dismantle the cartels unless the targets are actually located, arrested, and brought to justice. Even when charged in U.S. courts, cartel fugitives will continue their illegal operations while taking refuge outside our borders, primarily in Mexico or Colombia. With virtually limitless resources at their command, they are able to deploy the most technically advanced equipment to avoid detection and further their criminal enterprises. Thus, an important component of the overall Strategy is the location, apprehension and extradition of fugitives with the priority being the top leadership of the cartels. The USMS is the U.S. government's primary agency for apprehending fugitives. Through its regional fugitive task forces, district-based violent offender task forces, and Technical Operations Group, the USMS works with state and local police agencies on both sides of the border to locate and arrest offenders who have committed drug crimes or drug-related crimes of violence in the United States and subsequently fled abroad, as well as those who have been charged in the United States but remain resident in other countries. These units, particularly when co-located within the OCDETF Strike Forces or similar multi-agency institutions, place a high priority on apprehending cartel-related fugitives, both domestically and internationally. It is critical that the Department maintain its commitment to support and expand these international fugitive apprehension efforts.

## 5. Expanded Use of the Extradition Process

During the past three years, Mexico has extradited fugitives to the United States in unprecedented numbers. Many were significant cartel leaders, including leaders of the notorious Tijuana and Gulf Cartels. To build on these successes, and to handle more effectively the growing number of cases involving extraditions and securing foreign evidence from Mexico in cartel-level drug cases, the Department is establishing a new, dedicated Mexican OCDETF unit in the Criminal Division's Office of International Affairs (OIA). We anticipate that this unit will work proactively with, among others, the U.S. Attorney's Offices and the USMS, to prioritize fugitives and defendants in Mexico, ensuring that the time-consuming and resource-intensive extradition process is brought to bear against the most significant cartel leaders.

## 6. Continued Pursuit of Corrupt Public Officials Who Facilitate the Drug Trade

NDIC's 2009 National Drug Threat Assessment estimates that Mexican and Colombian cartels generate, remove, and launder between \$18 billion and \$39 billion in wholesale drug proceeds annually. With access to such vast sums of money, it is not surprising that the cartels are able to facilitate their illegal objectives through intimidation, extortion, and corruption of public officials and law enforcement officers on both sides of the border. The FBI's expertise in complex, sensitive public corruption investigations is a key component of the Department's overall anti-cartel Strategy. Using intelligence from the OFC, the SWIG, and FBI's own comprehensive intelligence networks, its agents work with experienced U.S. prosecutors, as well as their foreign counterparts, to root out public corruption that undermines our nation's defenses and the rule of law along the Southwest Border. It is imperative that the Department's Strategy

support these efforts to vigorously investigate and prosecute corruption, and to seek substantial prison terms for persons convicted of these crimes. Aggressive and effective prosecutions, followed by long sentences, send a clear message that these crimes will not be tolerated and that those engaging in them do so at their peril.

## 7. Merida

It is crucial to this Strategy that the Department continue its role under the Merida Initiative in working with our Mexican counterparts to enhance and strengthen Mexico's operational capacities to effectively combat the power of the cartels. This involves a broad range of capacity building and rule of law issues, including such topics as prosecutorial capacity building, evidence collection, fugitive apprehension, extradition, asset forfeiture, police professionalization, judicial security, witness protection, prison management, and corrections strategies. These efforts are crucial as a means of putting Mexico in the position to handle investigation and prosecution of these organizations as a domestic criminal matter.

This last pillar of the Strategy seeks to take full advantage of the substantial Department assets stationed in Mexico, including the Department's Rule of Law Attaches (Resident Legal Advisors, Intermittent Legal Advisors, Law Enforcement Advisors) and Prosecutorial Attaches, and each law enforcement component's resources stationed throughout Mexico. These vital positions will help facilitate the Department's Mexican Cartel Strategy by delivering crucial training to our law enforcement counterparts, lending investigative expertise and intelligence support to Mexican operations, helping bolster civil institution building in Mexico, training Mexican prosecutors on best practices and trial techniques, and assisting the Mexican judicial system in promoting the rule of law. Additionally, the Department will actively participate in Embassy initiatives such as the GC Armas Policy Committee.

Dear Senator Grassley:

This responds to your letter, dated January 27, 2011, to Acting Director Kenneth Melson of the Department's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF), regarding Project Gunrunner. We request that you urge the individuals who made the serious allegations in your letter to communicate them directly to the Department's Office of the Inspector General.

We want to assure you that, contrary to the allegations reported in your letter, ATF has not "sanctioned" the sale of assault weapons to suspected straw purchasers, who then transported the weapons throughout the southwest border area and into Mexico. Indeed, an important goal of Project Gunrunner is to stop the flow of weapons from the United States to drug cartels in Mexico. Since its inception in 2006, Project Gunrunner investigations have seized in excess of 10,000 firearms and 1.1 million rounds of ammunition destined for Mexico. Hundreds of individuals have been convicted of criminal offenses arising from these investigations and many others are on-going. We would be pleased to provide a briefing to Committee staff about Project Gunrunner and ATF's efforts to work with its law enforcement partners to build cases that will disrupt and dismantle criminal organizations.

We are not in a position to provide a briefing about the on-going criminal investigation referenced in your letter. As you know, the Department has a long-standing policy against the disclosure of non-public information about pending criminal investigations, which protects our law enforcement efforts as well as the privacy interests of individuals who may never be charged with criminal offenses. We can advise you, however, that ATF makes every effort to interdict weapons that have been purchased illegally and prevent their transportation to Mexico. It is also important to note that not all purchases are known to be illegal at the time they occur. In addition, the fact that an individual purchased weapons as a straw on one occasion does not, standing alone, establish probable cause to conclude that he is acting as a straw in making other purchases. Accordingly, we caution strongly against making assumptions about particular actions that may have been taken during this, or any other, pending investigation.



On March 21, 2011, the Acting Inspector General (IG) for the Department of Justice advised Acting Director Melson that the IG's Oversight and Review Division recently initiated a review of certain ATF firearms trafficking investigations. In a March 21 memo, the Assistant IG for the Oversight and Review Division stated that the review would cover the matter known as Operation Fast and Furious, and other investigations with similar objectives, methods, and strategies. On March 25, 2011, Acting Director Melson received the attached request for documents and information relating to the IG review of certain firearms trafficking investigations.

On March 28, 2011, AD Stinnett sent each of you instructions on how to respond to the March 25, 2011 document request. She also sent each of you a document preservation request relative to Operation Fast and Furious.

On March 31, 2011 the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform (HCOGR) issued a subpoena for documents related to Operation Fast and Furious and the FBI investigation into the death of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry.

While the IG document request and the HCOGR subpoena are generally directed at the same investigation, they are distinctly different in their scope. To minimize the impact of these two document requests, facilitate production of responsive documents, and ensure the confidentiality of responses, we will combine them into one request and secure them electronically. (Accordingly, to the extent that AD Stinnett's March 28, 2011 asked for you to produce hard copy documents to her office, you can disregard that portion of her guidance). The due date for the electronic production of responsive documents and certification of search is close of business Monday, April 11, 2011.

Regardless of any prior production of responsive documents to any entity inside or outside of ATF, everyone is required to produce any responsive documents, e-mails, etc. at this time. All responsive documents anywhere in the organization must be produced. Further, all documents must be fully produced. There is no authority for ATF to withhold records, or redact portions of records because we believe they are sensitive or confidential or privileged. The IG has statutory authority to obtain any and all records related to this review.

ACTION ITEM FOR EACH AD AND EMPLOYEES IN EACH DIRECTORATE

Please carefully review both the attached OIG request for documents and the attached HCOGR request and forward to each office within your area of responsibility. These documents should be forwarded to each employee in every office under your supervision. While it is likely that most of the requested records will be housed at the Phoenix Field Division or Bureau headquarters, it is nonetheless critical that each SAC and HQ Official ensure a thorough search is conducted at each field and headquarters division and any responsive record is forwarded as instructed. Please err on the side of caution and be over inclusive in producing documents or information.

Also attached is a revised verification certification that covers document production for the OIG and the HCOGR which needs to be signed and dated by each SAC and HQ Official. If your division does not have responsive materials, please note "no responsive records found" on the certification and provide a copy of the signed document as instructed below. A scanned copy of this document should be placed in the division folder as described below using the naming convention of "Division\_Certification" e.g. Phoenix\_Certification. Personnel in the Office of Field Operations should also e-mail a copy of their certification to Program Analyst (b) (7)(C)

All production of responsive materials is to be in electronic form only as outlined below. Do not submit paper copies to headquarters. Any responsive document or other communication that is not currently in electronic form is to be scanned.

PROCESS FOR EACH EMPLOYEE TO SUBMIT RESPONSIVE DOCUMENTS ELECTRONICALLY

ATF will compile all responsive documents by having employees place electronic copies of the documents into a shared computer drive. Do not produce hard copies or e-mail copies of documents to HQ.

Each employee and task force officer in ATF has been given access to a nationwide shared computer drive titled "Fast and Furious investigation." Access to this drive was automatically created when you logged in to your computer Monday, April 4, 2011.

If you have responsive documents to submit, follow the procedure below to deposit them into the shared drive in the appropriate location. If you have no responsive documents, complete your certification and return it in accordance with the instructions provided by your supervisor.

### How to Access the Fast and Furious Investigation shared drive.

To access this drive, place your mouse pointer over the "Start" button in the lower left corner of your screen and right click, then select "Explore."

Scroll down until you see a drive labeled "Fast and Furious Investigation." (If you do not see this drive and your computer has not been rebooted recently, you will need to log out of the network and log back in so that the network may create your access to the shared drive.)

Left click on that drive.

Scroll to your field division or Headquarters Directorate

Left Click on that folder

#### **How to Create a Document Folder**

Next create a new user folder to hold your responsive documents. To do this:

Go to the top menu and select "File"

Then select "New"

Then select "Folder"

Name the new folder with your login id (network user id)

Left click on the folder you just created to enter it

Copy any responsive documents into your folder in the shared drive.

## About your folder:

Only you can access your folder. No one else in your office, division, or directorate can view your submission(s).

Similarly, you cannot access anyone else's folder.

You can deposit documents into the folder, but once deposited in the folder you cannot read, rename, modify, or delete them.

#### Saving scanned documents

If you must scan a document to submit it, please save it using the following naming convention:

Your login ID\_description\_of\_the\_document\_date of the document

Where Your login ID is your **network login ID**, followed by an underscore and the description of the document, for example, "\_division\_firearms\_trafficking\_guidance\_memo\_" followed by the date of the original document **201104XX** expressed as a four digit year followed by two digit month and 2 digit day

An example of a properly named scanned file might look like this:

Phoenix Field Division personnel need not produce e-mails to the shared folder, all Phoenix employees' e-mail will be collected automatically. Each Phoenix user will receive a network notification advising them that their e-mail folders are being copied from their pc in response to this information collection. All Phoenix employees are required to cooperate with this collection process.

#### How to Save Small Quantities of Responsive E-Mails

To save a singular responsive e-mail follow these steps:

Open the e-mail

Left Click on the "Office Button" Icon in the upper left hand corner

Select "Save As"

Browse to your folder on the shared drive.

In the Save as type: dialogue box be sure to select Outlook Message Format (\*.msg)

Save the file directly to your folder in the shared drive.

### How to Save Large quantities of responsive E-Mails

Move all responsive e-mails to a single folder within Outlook – create a new folder if need be.

Once you have moved all responsive e-mails into the folder, highlight the folder on the folder list.

Left click "File" in the upper left hand corner of the Outlook window

In the dialogue box select "Import and Export"

In the next dialogue box select "Export to a File," then click "Next"

In the next dialogue box select "Personal Folder File (.pst)," then click "Next"

In the next dialogue box select (highlight by clicking on it) the folder where you have stored the responsive e-mails, then click "Next"

In the next dialogue box in the "Save exported file as" box, browse to your folder on the shared drive and save the .pst file containing your e-mail folder naming it using the following naming convention:


